It is to be held from 3 to 9 March. The 2024 Festival, chaired by producer Raffaella De Laurentiis and by the director Michelle Danner, will honor director Matteo Garrone for the Academy Award-nominated international feature "Io Capitano". The event, which introduces the famous night of the Oscars and promotes Italian cinema around the world, has a varied and very full program, which includes an "Italian Masters" section by Intesa Sanpaolo. Director Lina Sastri is the Italian Master being celebrated at the 2024 edition of the Festival, with the world premiere of her work "La casa di Ninetta" being screened on March 3. The famous artist will be in attendance and will introduce the film to the audience in the hall.

Italian Masters by Intesa Sanpaolo will present also other films directed by legendary masters of italian cinema as "La quattordicesima domenica del tempo ordinario" by Pupi Avati, "Rapito" (Kidnapped) by Marco Bellocchio, "L'ordine del tempo" by Liliana Cavani and "Il ritorno di Casanova" (Casanova's Return) di Gabriele Salvatores, all financially supported by Intesa Sanpaolo as well as "Paradox Effect", "Martedì e Venerdì", "Addio al Nubilato 2", "Mameli – il ragazzo che sognò l'Italia", that are included in the Festival program.

Through its specialist Media & Culture Desk, Intesa Sanpaolo is a leader in the national audiovisual market with D2.6 billion disbursed to the sector since 2009 and has financially supported the production of more than 600 national and international films and TV series and over 170 commercials, factuals and TV formats. 



THIS IS THE YEAR OF PIGELES, ITALIA

Inseparable teenagers Seydou and Moussa are bound together by their love for music and the songs they compose and sing for their friends on the streets of Dakar, Senegal. But the two teenagers dream of Europe, a far away land that is said to offer a thousand opportunities.

One night they secretly leave their homes and set off on a long journey to reach the African shores washed by the Mediterrenean Sea. They share the same dream: to see the world, pursue their aspirations and improve their lives. Rather than by a desperate need to escape from misery and war, they are driven by a strong sense of independence and self affirmation.

But Seydoux and Moussa cannot begin even to imagine what kind of dangerous adventure awaits them: a dramatic odissey through the perils of the desert, the horrors of the Lybian detention centers and the threats of the sea. They will be confronted with all the mythological monsters encountered by the heroes of legend. It is clear that to filmmaker Matteo Garrone, migrants are modern-day epic figures.

Competing at the 8oth edition of the Venice Film Festival, "Io Capitano" earned the Silver Lion for Best Director and the Marcello Mastroianni Award for Best Emerging Actor (Seydou Sarr). The movie was subsequently nominated for Best International Feature Film in the forthcoming Oscars edition.

"This is a great honor, and we are happy that our adventure continues," declared the director Matteo Garrone, after finding out that his movie had been ranked among the Oscar finalists. "I tried to tell a story from the point of view of a young migrant who embarks on a life-changing journey. I am aware that my film has a political value, but it is also narrates an incredible adventure comparable to those of Homer, a coming of age story accessible to everyone, even those who would never watch this movie."

Inspired by real life stories to which he adds a magical space where everything can happen, sophisticated and popular Garrone's filmmaking has produced some of the most impactful and interesting movies of the past few years.



Three Italian American performers are working their way up the ladder to become as acknowledged and celebrated as Robert De Niro

The 96th edition of the Academy Awards acknowledges the worthy performances by three actors of Italian origin who have become true household names on the Hollywood scene, thanks to the talent and passion that characterize their work. Paul Giamatti, the extraordinary protagonist of "The Holdovers" by Alexander Payne, could be on the verge of enjoying the greatest recognition of his brilliant career. He has been particularly appreciated in the role of a grumpy New England private school professor who chooses to spend his 1970 Christmas holidays at the campus, so he can check in on the students who aren't going back home during the break. This is how he becomes friends with a weird and troubled young man (the up and coming actor Dominic Sessa) and with the school cook (Da'Vine Joy Randolph), who has lost her only son in the Vietnam war. A winner of three Golden Globes, three Critics Choice Awards, one Emmy and four Screen Actors Guild Awards, Giamatti had previously been nominated by the Academy for Best Actor in a Supporting Role with the movie

Bradley Cooper, who enjoys a very deep bond with his mother Gloria Campano and also with his Italian origins, will be contending for an Oscar in three categories ("Best Film" in his producing capacity; "Best Actor in a Leading Role" and "Best Original Screenplay") for the film "Maestro," a sentimental biography about the lifelong complicated relationship between legendary musician Leonard Bernstein and his wife, Felicia Montealegre.

Nominated for a fourth time is Oscar nominee Mark Ruffalo, who is up this year for "Best Actor in a Supporting Role" for playing a sly and skilled lawyer in Yorgos Lanthimos' "Poor Things" opposite Emma Stone in the role of Bella, the woman he takes a fancy to, and with whom he flees on a life changing journey to explore the world and sexuality.




WELL DONE, GIORGIO GHIOTTO!

Though did not make it into the final five, Italian newcomer Giorgio Ghiotto can say he is satisfied. The 15 shortlisted documentary short films include "Wings of Dust," written, directed and edited by the 24-year-old Roman filmmaker. In October, Ghiotto's documentary was nominated for a Student Academy Award, an acknowledgment created by the Academy of Motion Picture in 1973 and dedicated to film students around the world. This recognition automatically qualified his work for the Occar race. "Wings recognition automatically qualified his work for the Oscar race. "Wings of Dust" tells the story of Vidal Merma, a Peruvian indigenous Quechua journalist who struggles against pollution caused by mining exploitation.







Raffaella De Laurentiis is an Italian producer and the daughter of two legends of the film industry: produce Dino De Laurentiis and actress Silvana Mangano. After initially studying architecture, she started at a very young age to work as property master and set designer on her father's productions. Her first important job came in 1973 as an assistant costume designer in Luchino Visconti's "Ludwig." Raffaella, however, realized that her talent would be best expressed in helming the production and organization of a movie. She worked as a production assistant on "Hurricane" before taking on the role of producer at Dino De Laurentiis Productions.

One of her first major successes was "Conan the Barbarian," a film adaptation of the hero created in the 1930s by pulp writer Robert E. Howard. The film blended fantasy with adventure cinema, retrieved the Myths of Antiquity by projecting them into a futuristic universe, but above all it launched Arnold Schwarzenegger's career as an actor and an icon of 1980s action movies.

More ill-fated was the box-office outcome of "Dune," directed by David Lynch, with whom Dino and Raffaella De Laurentiis brought to the screen the novel that Frank Herbert published in 1965 and which is still regarded as one of the milestones of literary science fiction and beyond.

After leaving her father's production company, Raffaella set out on her own, handling numerous projects: "Prancer," a Christmas story about a little girl, sad and withdrawn because of her mother's death, who finds a hurt reindeer in the woods and nurtures it; "Dragonheart," a fantasy film series set in the Middle Ages that follows the adventures of several dragons willing to share their hearts with a human being; "Kull the Conqueror," about the vicissitudes of a barbarian warrior who, thanks to his skill and courage, becomes a king, fighting against evil; "Backdraft," an action-thriller with dramatic elements set in the world of firefighters and directed by Ron Howard; and "The Forbidden Kingdom," an exciting mix of adventure, irony and a coming-of-age story that for the first time brings two Asian film stars together on the big screen: Jackie Chan and Jet Li.

During the G20 summit in Rome, the President of the Italian Republic, Sergio Mattarella, held a bilateral meeting with US President, Joseph R. Biden, during which the two leaders reaffirmed their countries' deeply-rooted friendship. President Biden stressed the importance of diplomatic relationships between Italy and the US several times, and he thanked Mattarella for hosting the G20 summit, where the world's major economies came together to tackle delicate issues such as climate change, the handling of the pandemic, and the nations' plans for economic recovery. A staunch supporter of multilateralism, Biden expressed his country's intention to deepen its relationships with its traditional allies, including Italy. Americans have always been generous to Italians, while continuously showing a deep appreciation for Italian history, culture, and art. In the past several decades, Italian foreign policy has been able to simultaneously preserve the nations status as a European leader, as well as its unwavering loyalty to the US, by establishing a vast network of relationships in the fields of politics, economy, business, science and culture. President Biden also has personal ties to Italy, as Jill Biden is the first US President's spouse of Italian descent in history. Her family name, Giacoppa, was anglicized into Jacobs by her grandfather Gaetano, who emigrated to America from the Sicilian village of Gesso, near Messina. 
UNDERLINES THE IMPORTANCE OF PUBLIC CONTRIBUTION O THE CINEMATIC AND AUDIOVISUAL ARTS

The Undersecretary for Culture expressed enthusiasm for the recovery of a crucial sector for Italian employment, economy and culture

The public contribution/incentive system of the Italian film and audiovisual sector is in good health. This was confirmed by a report on the financial condition of the

Italian cinema and audiovisual industry, edited by the Office of Studies of the General Direction for Cinema and Audiovisual, and presented at the 2023 edition of MIA Market, the largest and most important Italian event in this field. "Research shows the importance of public contribution for the film and audiovisual production sector," stated Undersecretary for Culture Lucia Borgonzoni. "Today's numbers reveal a healthy system – the film and audiovisual sector is still a leader for employment, economy and culture in Italy. The Ministry is continuing to work to increase investment in the Italian film industry, and this historic record allows us to lay the foundation for our future work. The positive results are evidenced by the awards won in Venice and the nomination of Garrone's terrific film for an Oscar, confirming that Italy is the home of cinema and that Italians love cinema."

Satisfaction was also expressed at the "Cinema Revolution" initiative, the campaign launched last summer by the Ministry of Culture with the support of Cinecittà, aimed at bringing audiences back to movie theaters. Cinetel registered historical data that surpassed the achievements of 2019, which had previously stood as the best year on record. Compared to 2022, last year saw as many as 10 million more viewers. "Theaters were the only criticality in the sector," continued Bergonzoni, "but last summer we finally managed to resolve it, and the trend is now improving.

If you want to find someone who knows all the ins and outs of show business, look at Michelle Danner and her list of accomplishments. Recognized as a successful performer, acting coach and teacher, entrepreneur, filmmaker, and stage director, Michelle Danner has had experience in almost every area of the film industry. She's continued to teach at the Los Angeles Acting School which specializes in the Meisner, Strasberg, Adler and Stanislavsky techniques. She is also the founding and artistic director of the Edgemar Center for the Arts. It was her father, Alexander Valdez, who opened the very first "William Morris Agency" in Paris, France. That instilled a strong passion and word that stayed with her. After studying acting in Paris and New York with Stella Adler and Uta Hagen, Danner has taught acting privately for the last 30 years, with celebrities and at her acting studio, the Los Angeles Acting Conservatory.

Her film directorial debut was with "How to Go Out on a Date in Queens," winning the LA Film Awards' Best Acting and Best Movie awards. Her 2013 thriller "Hello Herman" catalogs the effect that peer abuse, parental neglect and the general coarsening of society has on a typical high school student. She directed the family film "The Bandit Hound," the thrillers "Bad Impulse" and "The Runner."

Danner has acted in and directed over thirty plays in Los Angeles and New York, with her favorite acting credit cited as Tennessee Williams' Dramalogue award-winning "The Rose Tattoo." At Edgemar, Danner produced "The Night of the Black Cat," winner of the 2005 Best Musical of the Year at the Los Angeles Music Awards. In 2020, she reunited with Paul Sorvino for the horror film "Bad Impulse," premiering at the TLC Chinese Theatre as part of the Golden State Film Festival. Two years later Danner directed Anna Archer in "Ticket to the Circus," a one-woman play about the life of Norris Church Mailer. The legal thriller "Miranda's Victim" starring Abigail Breslin, Ryan Phillippe, Luke Wilson, Mireille Enos, Andy Garcia and Donald Sutherland tells the unique story of Patricia Weir, who fought for justice after her assault in 1963. And in the aftermath, the Miranda Law was established.



talian origins, a Catholic background, close ties among friends and strong family relationships; violent and sinful laws of a merciless society: these are the themes that characterize the movies by Martin Scorsese, one of the greatest living directors.

An avid movie fan, a filmaker capable of amazing technical and expressive virtuosity, an author of documentaries that have delved into the American history, leaving a significant legacy in contemporary filmmaking and music. Scorsese continues to meditate on evil, death, the roots of the identity of contemporary man, and American history.

"Killers of the Flower Moon," written with Eric Roth and based on David Grann's book-enquiry with the same name, is a tragic and blood-soaked colossal movie on "the brutal grab for land, resources and power." A three and a half hour plot combining violence, love, illusion, oil and greed with historic and cultural truths that are still hard to accept.

The film received ten Oscar nominations, including one for Martin Scorsese in the "Best Director" category. This acknowledgment has made for an extraordinary milestone in the history of the Academy Awards, as Scorsese is now officially the most nominated living director, a record that he had held in a tie with Spielberg, and is now the oldest director to have this honor.


Only William Wyler, who, during his lifetime received 12, has done better than Scorsese.

Scorsese shared his feelings in an interview at "The Late Show with Steven Colbert": «For this particular film too, it's so exciting. But more than that, because the picture means so much to me, and it took a number of years for gestation. I mean, you look back. Ten nominations over the years. I honestly don't know how that happened. I don't know, because you never make films for awards. You make the film the best way you can make them. I'm very pleased that so many people have been nominated for the film, including Robbie Robertson, his wonderful score and the song they have in the film. This is something very special. Lily Gladstone, of course. Amazing. And Bob de Niro too. I'm sad about Leo. I would've liked to have seen him in there as Best Actor, but his presence is there; it's pivotal to the picture and the work».



A PERSONAL STORY IN A DIRECTORIAL DEBUT

Martin Scorsese's third child after Cathy and Domenica, Francesca Scorsese has been familiar with movie sets since she was a little girl. She graduated from NYU's Tisch School of the Arts, which is also her father's alma mater, and appeared in several of her dad's projects including "The Departed", "The Aviator" and "Boardwalk Empire". Luca Guadagnino chose her to play Britney Orton in HBO's "We Are Who We Are". She premiered her directorial debut "Fish Out of Water" in June 2023. The 25-minute drama, which follows a struggling young mom who has an opportunity to reconnect with her estranged family after her now-sober father shares news of her mother's failing health, was originally Francesca's thesis for NYU.



Robert De Niro's nomination for the role of the wicked William Hale in "Killers of the Flower Moon" has once again showcased the longstanding and extraordinary talent of an actor who has left a profound mark on film history. Martin Scorsese's acclaimed ten-Oscar nominee epic western drama confirms that the Italian American director still dominates the world cinematic scene.

Born in New York City in 1943, Robert De Niro stands as true legend in the American film history with a career that is rocketing towards its 60th anniversary in 2025. De Niro's versatility has resulted in his ability to excel in a vast range of film genres, from "Taxi Driver" to "Raging Bull," "Once Upon a Time in America," "The Mission," "Awakenings" and "Silver Li<mark>ni</mark>ngs Playboo<mark>k</mark>."

With his ninth nomination, this time for "Best Supporting Actor," De Niro has set a new record: he is the actor with the longest gap between first and second Oscar nominations: first in 1975 for "The Godfather Part II" and second in 2024 for "Killers of the Flower Moon." This 49-year time span exceeds that of Katharine Hepburn's extraordinary achievements that featured a 48-year gap between her first and last Oscar nomination (for "On Golden Pond"). This record is a tribute to De Niro's consistency and relevance in the film landscape and it shows that his influential talent has remained unparalleled over the years.

On March 10, at the 2024 Oscars, De Niro will be competing with such Hollywood giants as Ryan Gosling, Mark Ruffalo, Sterling K. Brown and Robert Downey, Jr. Considering that De Niro's last Oscar win happened in 1981 for Martin Scorsese's "Raging Bull," winning in 2024 would set a new record for the longest gap between Oscar wins for an actor. That record is currently held by Helen Hayes, who won her first Oscar in 1932 for "The Sin of Madelon Claudet" and had to wait 39 years to win again in 1971 for "Airport".

Good luck Robert! Italy is rooting for you.

LEONARDO DICAPRIO

A NEW ROLE FOR PAUL MOVIE

Snubbed by the Academy, which denied him a nomination for his portrayal of the slimy and weak Ernest Bukhart in Martin Scorsese's "Killers of the Flower Moon, Leonardo DiCaprio has certainly not lost heart and is back on the set of an important film, directed by one of the New



Hollywood's most brilliant filmmakers, Paul Thomas Anderson. At the moment, the title of the film has not been revealed and the plot still remains a mystery. Some rumors suggest that it might be an adaptation of Thomas Pynchon's novel 'Vineland,' but this is only speculation. All we can do is wait.

The first to perceive the endless opportunities of the movie industry was Elvira Notari, who in 1908 founded Dora Film together with her husband. Many decades later Cecilia Mangini became the first Italian documentarist to depict, in an uncompromising film, the lives and conditions for women in the Italian suburbs. But it was only thanks to Lina Wertmuller and later to Liliana Cavani that a significant space opened up for female filmmaking despite the many obstacles.

Lina Wertmuller was the first woman to ever have been nominated for a Best Director Academy Award and to have eventually been awarded with a Lifetime Achievement Oscar, presented to her in 2019 by Sofia Loren, Isabella Rossellini, Greta Gerwig and Jane Campion. This acknowledgment, along with her star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame, speaks not only to the quality of Wertmuller's work, but also the pioneering role she assumed in a world dominated by men.

Italian female film directors have long been regarded as a unworthy minority when in fact they have been making an indelible mark on contemporary filmmaking. Among the leading Italian female filmmakers, Francesca Archibugi stands out, with her indepth exploration of family and the relationships and experiences of young people. Beside her, there are the artists of the Comencini family: director Cristina, a 2006 Oscar nominee for "Dont' Tell" ("The Beast in the Heart"), and her sisters Francesca (director) and Paola (set designer).

Also of note are Cinzia TH Torrini, Wilma Labate, Antonietta De Lillo, Roberta Torre, Simona Izzo, Alice Rohrwacher (whose reputation has reached the most prestigious international festivals), Valeria Golino, Maria Sole Tognazzi, Susanna Nicchiarelli, Laura Bispuri, Emma Dante, Ginevra Elkann, Elisa Amoruso, Costanza Quatriglio, Laura Samani, Micaela Ramazzotti, Anselma dell'Olio, Giulia Steigerwalt, Laura Luchetti, Giorgia Farina and Lyda Patitucci.

t has been a long time since Italian movie theaters welcomed crowds eager to celebrate an Italian film. But this is what recently happened with "There's Still Tomorrow," the celebrated directorial debut of Paola Cortellesi, whose film outdid such box office hits as Greta Gerwig's "Barbie" and Christopher Nolan's "Oppenheimer."

The buzz about Cortellesi's movie has gone viral and "There's Still Tomorrow" has become a top grossing film that has gradually reached the most varied audiences, touching their hearts through its daring and brilliant mixture of genres of the noble film tradition of our country.

Viewers have fallen in love with this story, set at the end of World War II, and focusing on the role of women and their need to change and improve their lives. 



She worked with Giuseppe Patroni Griffi, Mario Ferrero, Francesco Rosi, Luca De Fusco and incarnated such iconic stage characters as Filumena Marturano, Margherita Gautier, Petra von Kant, Elettra, Ecuba, Medea, Gilda Mignonette, as well as many other figures of classic and contemporary theater. She made her debut on the big screen in Pasquale Squitieri's "Il prefetto di ferro" followed by Gianfranco Mingozzi's "Gli ultimi tre giorni." His deeply human yet disenchanted characters will inhabit three movies: "Natale in Casa Cupiello," "Sabato, domenica e lunedì," "Non ti pago" starring Sergio Castellitto and directed by Edoardo De Angelis. These movies have been adapted for television and are to be considered as a whole in the director's project to highlight Eduardo's central topic: the family, a core of affection, passion and conflicts emerging either in tragic and comic situations.

With his latest effort, "Commander," Edoardo De Angelis navigates the waves between illusion and reality. Brought to the big screen is the true story of Salvatore Todaro, commander of the Royal Italian Navy submarine "Cappellini," during the Second World War. This colossal film, made in Italy, reminds us that the laws of the sea are more exacting than any war

A big name in the new Italian cinema, De Angelis is a daring filmmaker whose character-driven stories are rich with expressive freedom. A director, a screenwriter, and a producer, De Angelis discovered his love for cinema in his teens, his first short films shot in the abandoned quarries and countryside of Caserta. In 2006, De Angelis got his degree in film direction from the Experimental Center of Cinematography in Rome. His graduation essay was a short film entitled "Mistero e passione di Gino Pacino," the story of a man who dreams of making love with Saint Lucy, and the guilt that then causes him to go blind.

This short film earned De Angelis the Critics Award at the first edition of the Küstendorf Film and Music Festival. It was there that he met Emir Kusturica and Paula Vaccaro, who helped him make his first feature film, "Mozzarella Stories," marking the beginning of his unique and bright career.

After founding the company O'Groove with Pierpaolo Verga, in 2014 De Angelis directed and produced his second feature, "Perez," an urban crime mystery about a lawyer from Naples who breaks all the rules to defend his daughter, the fianceè of a dangerous criminal.

Castel Volturno's desolate lands form the backdrop of "Indivisible" - presented during Authors Days at the Venice Film Festival, earning him the Premio Pasinetti for Best Feature Film, with a special nod to the debuting twin sister actresses, Angela and Marianna Fontana.

De Angelis' next movie, "The Vice of Hope," is a vibrant social drama on poverty, African migrants, human trafficking and commercial surrogacy in the region dominated by the Camorra mob. But it is also a story of deep human resilience, when everything is dying and hope doesn't seem to have a chance. In 2020, De Angelis directed the opera "Tosca" for the San Carlo Theater in Naples, with set designs by Mimmo Paladino. That same year, De Angelis directed a movie based on "Natale in Casa Cupiello" by Eduardo De Filippo. This is the first adaptation of a trilogy starring Sergio Castellitto which celebrates the 120th anniversary of the birth of the legendary Neapolitan playwright and includes other

two movies: "Sabato, domenica e lunedì" and "Non ti pago.' Between 2021 and 2022, De Angelis successfully tried his hand at a TV series by adapting-for Netflix-a novel by one of the most beloved and translated authors in the world: Elena Ferrante's "The Lying Life of Adults.

His latest, "Comandante," set on board a submarine helmed by Commander Salvatore Todaro during the Second World War, opened the 80th edition of the International Venice Film Festival.





In 2023 star dedicated to the Italian actor GIANCARLO GIANNINI adding to the list of Italian artists honoured on the Hollywood Walk of Fame

A mericans have always had a love affair with Italy. Whether it is Italy's wonderful cuisine, incredible landscapes, culture, history or film, people love it. In Los Angeles, everybody has a special affinity for Italy. Numerous people of Italian descent settled here, in places such as San Pedro, where they became a mainstay of the fishing community.

In autumn, Hollywood is the home of the annual Feast of San Gennaro. The event, sponsored by television personality Jimmy Kimmel, attracts thousands of people to enjoy Italian food, music and culture. The contribution of Italian artists to international show business has been officially acknowledged many times on Hollywood's Walk of Fame, where the world's most prominent stars are honored in recognition of their achievements in the fields of film, radio, music, theater and television, as well as for their civic and charitable commitments. Many of these stars bear Italian names, such as the orchestra conductor Arturo Toscanini, tenor Enrico Caruso, the legendary Rodolfo Valentino, three extraordinary actresses Anna Magnani, Sophia Loren and Gina Lollobrigida, director Bernardo Bertolucci, singer Andrea Bocelli and Maestro Ennio Morricone, the most beloved music composer in the film industry.

Before the glamorous night during which Morricone was presented with an Oscar for the score he composed for Quentin Tarantino's "The Hateful Eight," the legendary composer posed for photographers and TV crews as his Walk of Fame star was unveiled. Among those attending the ceremony was the "Pulp Fiction" director who has always been one of his biggest fans.

In 2019 a star dedicated to the Italian filmmaker Lina Wertmuller, the first woman to receive an Oscar nomination for Best Director, adding to the list of Italian artists honoured on the Hollywood Walk of Fame.



Mastroianni and Fellini were introduced to each other by Fellini's wife, actress Giulietta Masina. The celebrated director was looking for a young lead for "La Dolce Vita," a new movie he was about to direct. When he met Mastroianni, he immediately felt he had found the perfect performer to portray the film's central character, a journalist writing for gossip magazines, who becomes a witness of a crowd of restless individuals whose rich social life conceals their deep existential chasm. Their professional relationship became intense when Mastroianni was to some extent encouraged to identify with the director during his performance in "8 1/2," Fellini's autobiographical masterpiece, which highlighted Marcello's playful appeal. Fellini's extravagant, excessive and almost baroque movies had a profound effect on Mastroianni: He was no longer an actor playing a part, but a man who found himself confronted with his true self, his family, his women, his friends, a human being who could turn his doubts and uncertainties into a valuable baggage he defended on and off the screen.

"Marcello is not my alter ego! It's the other way around... I'm his alter ego," Fellini would often declare. The director found it difficult to let go of his favorite actor when Mastroianni worked in other directors' movies. Together they also did "City of Women," "Ginger & Fred" and "Intervista.





WITH SOPHIA LOREN THE PERFECT MATCH

Talent, elegance, overwhelming emotions. These are the buzz words for a great cinematic duo, Marcello Mastroianni and Sophia Loren, who for some thirty years, sprinkled their magic onto the silver screen, worthily representing and honoring the Italian cinema in many unforgettable movies, often helmed by the globally renowned director Vittorio De Sica. In the 1960's these two stars represented a sure-fire recipe for a movie's success, as they were adored and followed by legions of fans. Their strong personalities and different approaches

on set created one of the most successful and impactful professional relationships in the world of cinema.

Together they worked on 14 movies, giving life to intense, ironic, poignant characters who became unforgettable icons of a fast evolving age.

Thanks to their eclectic talent, Loren and Mastroianni recounted several stories set in a country eager to overcome the misery of the Second World War, and their movies are forever imprinted on the memory of global audiences.

TTe would perform as if he were playing. Mastroianni was a lovable and outgoing man with a sensual, warm and kind voice. Beloved by the audience, coddled by directors, Marcello Mastroianni, born in the province of Frosinone 100 years ago, left an indelible mark as a man and an artist, in the Italian and international film

Mastroianni was a versatile and deeply human artist, supported by an incredible talent and a lively intelligence that allowed him to embody his characters without identifying with them or invading the film with

Yet Mastroianni had to work hard before becoming one of the most prominent actors of the Italian cinema. He rose through the ranks after his debut in the theater with Luchino Visconti, who directed him on stage in the Italian adaptation of "A Streetcar Named Desire."

On the silver screen he immediately proved his talent in "Le Notti Bianche" with his turn as of one of Fyodor Dostoevsky's most heart-wrenching melancholic heroes. But Mastroianni's breakout moment came with "Big Deal on Madonna Street" (1958) by Mario Monicelli, which brought out his flair for comedy.

But it was his encounter with Federico Fellini in "La Dolce Vita" (1960), with his character's almost mythical journey into a Babylonian 1960s Rome, that turned Mastroianni into an international star.

After that, Mastroianni played an impressive number of significant roles that furthe-

red his fame as a Latin lover: the impotent "Handsome Antonio" by Mauro Bolognini, the writer in a crisis of "La Notte" by Michelangelo Antonioni, the baronet who kills his wife after being betrayed in "Divorce Italian Style" by Pietro Germi, the film that earned him the first of his three Oscar nominations for Best Supporting Actor.

His career navigated the whole of Italian film history. There is no other Italian actor who can boast such a rich filmography where quantity never comes at the expense of quality. Mastroianni incarnated an old professor in "The Organizer" (1963) by Monicelli, Loren's partner in "Marriage Italian Style" and "Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow" both directed by Vittorio De Sica; Marco Ferreri roughens up his glossy star image through films such as "La Cagna" (1972;) "La Grande Bouffe" (1973;) "Don't Touch the White Woman" (1974;) and "Bye Bye Monkey" (1978).

He worked with the Taviani Brothers on "Allonsanfan" (1974), with Elio Petri on "Todo modo" (1976), and with Ettore Scola on his masterpiece, "A Special Day.'

In the 80s and 90s Mastronianni's career turned more cosmopolitan and experimental through his working with Anghelopulos, Manoel de Oliveira, Roman Polanski, and Nikita Michalkov.

Marcello Mastroianni will forever be a symbol of the Italian cinema and the great seducer of audiences worldwide. A legend on and off the big screen, Mastroianni is a reference point for many young actors who look up to him with respect and admiration.




uca Barbareschi was born in Montevideo on the 28th of July, 1956. Moved to New York, he collaborated with the Chicago Lyric Opera Theatre. In 1983 produced, wrote and acted in his first film, "Summertime", which won at the Venice, Sydney, London, Annecy and Nice film festivals. ne of the most heartfelt and interesting goals of Festival LA, Italia is its effort to amplify the fame of Italian talents on the international scene, thus continuing to promote and renew the great tradition of our cinema. Since 2006, the year the festival debuted, a long list of young movie talents have enjoyed the opportunity to make themselves known in Hollywood during the 'awards season,' a time of the year when the whole world eagerly looks to Hollywood, the cinema's global capital. Some of these actors are: Raoul Bova, Carlo Carlei, Claudia

Gerini, Enrico Lo Verso, Marco Pontecorvo, Riccardo Scamarcio, Maria Sole Tognazzi, Kim Rossi Stuart, Carolina Crescentini, Isabella Ragonese, Adriano Giannini, Pappi Corsicato, and Fabio De Luigi.

Over the years many young budding talents - not just Italian - have visited the festival and become its aficionados, including Bradley Cooper, whose Italian origins have encouraged him to explore the people and stories of contemporary Italy. In past editions of La Italia, three emerging Italian performers, Lorenzo Richelmy, Michele Ragno and Benedetta Porcaroli,

have attracted the attention of the international media with their presence at Grauman's Chinese Theatre.

Richelmy has become one of the most sought-after actors worldwide after his success in the role of Marco Polo in the Netflixproduced series of the same name; Michele Ragno has proven his talent in "School of Mafia" by Alessandro Pondi; Benedetta Porcaroli, after debuting in Paolo

2006-2023 • EIGHTEEN SUCCESSFUL YEARS

2006 (February 26-March 4) The Italian cinema passed the test at the first L.A. Italia Festival with over 10,000 viewers attending thirty movie screenings.

Even though our Academy Award nominees didn't win - Cristina Comencini, director of "Don't Tell"; Gabriella Pescucci, costume designer for "Charlie and the Chocolate Factory" and Dario Marinelli, music composer for "Pride & Prejudice" - the Capri in the World Institute took home the awareness that "... a solid bridge for a cultural exchange is being built - since 1995 – between the Island of Capri with its "Capri, Hollywood" festival and Los Angeles, California," as declared by Pascal Vicedomini, founder and producer of these two events. Hollywood also witnessed the debut of festival co-founders Marina Cicogna, Franco Nero, Lina Wertmüller and Tony Renis (regarded as the musical 'soul' of the group and immediately elected its "Honorary Chairman").

For starters, the 2006 L.A. Italia event, whose official poster of the festival featured a night shot of the Colosseum, enjoyed the support of Cim Group Inc (with its principal Shaul Kuba), the Lazio Region, and Rai Trade, as well as Mibac (D.G.Cinema). Among the attractions that mostly engaged the audience, we recall: 1) Lina Wertmüller's film retrospective: The well-known Italian director was treated to a Hollywood party in her honor organized by producer David Codikov, complete with a welcoming speech by Al Pacino. She was also invited to lecture a class of students attending the University Southern California; 2) A retrospective about the talented Gabriele Muccino, presenting his first all-American movie with Will Smith; 3) Valentino and Gabriella Pescucci's costume exhibitions, the first based on nine elegant party gowns created for Gwyneth Paltrow, Renée Zellweger, Cate Blanchett, Kate Beckinsale, Jennifer Garner, Kate Hudson, Sandra Bullock and Elle MacPherson; the second on nine costumes created by Sartoria Tirelli in Rome for Michelle Pfeiffer, Jessica Lange, Uma Thurman, Demi Moore, Monica Bellucci, Jacqueline Bisset, Catherine Deneuve, Robert De Niro and Johnny Depp; 5) A photo expo on cinema in the Lazio Region, attended by two masters of the Italian haute cuisine: chefs Massimo Riccioli and Anna Dente; 6) NIAF's big gala night at the Regent Beverly Wilshire led by Jack Valenti (then the long-time president

of the Motion Picture Association of America) with two exceptional guests: Oscar -winning actor Ernest Borgnine and L.A. Mayor Antonio Villaraigosa. Actors Raoul Bova, Stefania Rocca, Enrico Lo Verso and Carlo Carlei stood out among the official delegation, as did songwriter Gigi D'Alessio who was touring the West Coast at that time. Among the illustrious guests were

Oscar recipients Norman Jewison and Jon Voight (who recently was the extraordinary protagonist of the Rai-Lux Vide TV movie dedicated to Pope John Paul II, a role that won him and producer Tom Sternberg the L.A. Italia Excellence Award, designed by Micucci). With them were Paul Mazursky, Jacqueline Bisset, Dolph Lundgren, Roxanna Arquette, the up-and-coming star Gerard Butler, Keith Carradine and finally, producers Larry Turman, Lawrence Bender, Steven Paul and Barry Navidi.

The divine Ms. Sophia Loren made an appearance at the Silvia Damiani event.

2007 (February 18-24) This was the year of the big popular festival breakthrough on the West Coast: costume designer Milena Canoero was awarded her third Oscar for Sofia Coppola's "Marie Antoinette". Sadly no prize went to makeup magicians Signoretti and Sodano.

The L.A. Italia event calendar presented a brilliant retrospective dedicated to legendary movie master Mario Monicelli, who was presented with a Lifetime Achievement Award by General Consul Diego Brasioli and IIC Director Francesca Valente, as well as with honors from the University of Southern California by Dean Elizabeth Dailey. This was the year of the collaboration with Shoah Foundation and Mimmo Calopresti's documentary, "Volevo solo vivere", screened on the opening day of the festival. The emotionally-charged event engaged both audiences and the media, who rushed in to listen to the speech given by Douglas Greenberg, Executive Director of USC's Shoah

and Education. It was also the year of the charity gala event for the movie "Invisible Children", produced by MKFilm and Maria Grazia Cucinotta with UNICEF and the World Food Program. There was also a memorable tribute to maestro Ennio Morricone, who received the Academy's Lifetime Achievement Award from Clint Eastwood. Not to mention Italian rocker Vasco Rossi's surprise appearance at the special screening of Stefano Salvati's video-clip, in which he was the lead character. The 2007 edition guests included Raoul Bova with Federico Moccia, Claudia Gerini with Federico Zampaglione and, next to Valeria Golino, Hollywood first-timer Riccardo Scamarcio, who connected immediately with Jeff Goldblum. Director Giulio Base, together with Dolph Lundgren and the Cruz sisters, Penelope and Monica, introduced his new movie "L'inchiesta". Italian-American screenwriter Bobby Moresco (Academy Award for "Crash") debuted as festival chairman that year, too. At the Chinese Theatre, and at the Italian Lounge at Trastevere in Hollywood &



Highland Center (where singer Agostino Penna performed beautifully), Oscar winner Pietro Scalia, Carlo Gabriel Nero, Stefano Veneruso, Martina Stella, Luca Lionello, actors Matthew Modine, John Savage, Gina Gershon, film directors Harold Becker and Mick Davis, and producers Avi Lerner and Chiara Tilesi were there too.

The official image of the 2007 Festival edition was Venice's Grand Canal, owing to an explicit request by the Venice Casino that supports the event together with Cinecittà Holding, the Lazio Region, the Campania Region, Sangemini and Cafe do Brazil.

2008 (February 17-23) The festival that year started in the best possible way: Bernardo Bertolucci got a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame, a tribute granted by the Hollywood Chamber of Commerce upon the request of the Capri in the World Institute. The Maestro was

unable to attend due to his ailing health but nevertheless his star was unveiled in front of the Chinese Theatre.

The classic Italian cinema was represented by directors Carlo Lizzani and Citto Maselli, who were given the IIC Lifetime Achievement award by General Consul Nicola Faganello, and who - at the Chinese Theatre – gave an award to an exceptional guest: Italian-American actor and director Sylvester Stallone. Dante Ferretti, however, (with Francesca Lo Schiavo) was the main attraction as he received his second Oscar for his design of Tim Burton's "Sweeney Todd" sets. The same thrill was generated when composer Dario Marianelli basked in his moment of glory, bringing home the legendary statuette for scoring Joe Wright's "Atonement". The only one left out was the third Italian candidate, Andrea Jublin, a contender in the short film category.

The Italian delegation also included actor and filmmaker Michele Placido, Lina Sastri, Raoul Bova, Enrico Lo Verso and newcomers Valeria Solarino (the Festival 'godmother'), Federico Moccia, Francesco Apolloni, Louis Nero, Ilaria Borrelli, Maurizio Aiello and Antonella Ponziani.

Famous Italian songwriter Ron and the Bologna-born 'soulman' Andrea Mingardi were highly appreciated for their musical contributions.

Next to them, a few giants of the US industry: Oscar winners Steven Zaillian, Paul Haggis and F. Murray Abraham (who was involved with Stefano Todini and Patrizia Pellegrino in a small movie shot in Umbria). And then Steven Seagal, Keith Carradine, Treat Williams, Tomas Arana, Johan Collins, Lindsay Lohan, Sofia Vergara (still unknown to the mainstream), Romina Power with her brother Tyrone Jr. and producers Mark Canton, Jeremy Thomas, Kevin King and Humberto Gatica.

The official image of the 2008 edition was the Gulf of Naples projected onto a number of Hollywood buildings. The size of the audience revealed the growth of the event: about 13,000 people attended the Italian Art Gallery set up at the Hollywood & Highland Center. The audience, who was there to cheer on one of Italy's most beloved singers, included a number of celebrities who last year took part in a much appreciated edition of the festival: Alexander Desplat, Danny DeVito, Cheryl Boone Isaacs, Melissa Leo, Alessandra Querzola and Dennis Gassner (nominated for the set design of "2049"), producer Mark Canton, Sofia Vergara and Joe Manganiello, Marco Leonardi (starring in Ridley Scott's movie "All the Money in the World"), Maria Pia Calzone (who performed as the diabolical Angelica in the animated movie "Cinderella the Cat"), Lorenzo Richelmy and Michele Morrone.

2019 The 14th edition of Los Angeles Italia, the film festival which takes place in Hollywood during the week preceding the Oscars, opened with Claudio Giovannesi's "La paranza dei bambini" based on a novel by Roberto Saviano and selected for competition at the Berlin Film Festival. Giovannesi's movie once again reveals stories of denied childhood in social environments dominated by criminal bosses, and on the adolescents' penchant to escape society's rules.

Alessandro Preziosi and twin sisters
Angela and Marianna Fontana were the
first Italian movie stars to accept their
2019 Italian Excellence Awards at the
Chinese Theatre. Preziosi greeted the
audience with a performance honoring
Luigi Pirandello; the actor also presented
a selection of his films including the
recent "Nessuno come noi" by Volfango
de Biasi

Marianna Fontana presented "Capri-Revolution," an exclusive chapter that belongs to a hypothetical film trilogy through which director Mario Martone aims at reflecting of time and history. Angela Fontana is the leading character in a feature film dedicated to the Basilicata region. The screening of 'Lucania' paid a tribute to the city of Matera, the 2019 European Capital of Culture, and to the iconic filmmaker Francis Ford Coppola (whose family comes from that area), on his 80th birthday, to honor his strong ties to his Italian roots.

The 2019 edition of the festival, chaired by Igino Straffi, a leader in the Italian animation industry, was attended by actress Maria Grazia Cucinotta, Hayma Washington, former president and CEO of the Academy of Television Arts &

Sciences, screenwriter Nick Vallelonga (who later went on to win two Academy Awards for "The Green Book"), Andy Garcia, the American actor of Cuban descent, the young Italian talent Matteo Rovere (who presented "Il primo re," an original film on Rome's founding entirely spoken in proto-italic language) and the legendary Franco Nero, one of the most charismatic personalities of the Italian cinema, beloved by such film luminaries as Huston, Petri, Bellocchio, Chabrol and an inspiration for Quentin Tarantino who filmed "Django Unchained" as a successor of Sergio Corbucci's 1966 movie "Django."

The festival's closing ceremony was attended by many contenders for the Academy's 'golden statuette'. Included were Vallelonga, Adam McKay, director of "Vice," one of the nominees in the 'Best Film' category, Nicholas Britell and Terence Blanchard the composers of 'If the Street Could Talk" from the "BlacKkKlansman, Marc Shaiman and Scott Wittman, writers of "The Place Where Lost Things Go," a new song from "Mary Poppins Returns," and Anthony Rossomando, one of the writers of "Shallow," which was performed by Lady Gaga and Bradley Cooper in the acclaimed "A Star is Born."

2020 In the year of the big Oscar confrontation between Tarantino's "Once Upon A Time in Hollywood" and Scorsese' "The Irishman," with the unexpectedy victory of the south-korean movie "Parasite," Los Angeles, Italia paid a tribute to the memory of Kobe Bryant, the basketball star who tragically passed away a few days before the festival opening.

Bryant had lived and studied in Italy

and he had established a profound and privileged relationship with our country. In the inaugural evening of the festival, Diane Warren and Danny Huston received the La Italia Person of the Year award while musician Frank Stallone earned the Lifetime Achievement Award. Diane Warren, nominated for the 11th time to the Academy Awards for the original song "I'm Standing With You" sung by Chrissy Metz, is also a recipient of an Emmy Award, a Grammy Award and a Golden Globe as well as a place of honor in the Songwriters Hall of Fame. To celebrate the 100th anniversary of Federico Fellini's birth, the festival opened with the maestro's "Casanova" (1976) and ended with "Ginger & Fred" (1986).

Highlights of the "Italian Masters" section include: a tribute to Lina Wertmüller, who a few months before had received the coveted Lifetime Achievement Academy Award; a homage to Francesco Rosi with the screening of "Citizen Rosi" (a poignant documentary directed by Rosi's daughter Carolina and Didi Gnocchi, on the life of the extraordinary filmmaker;) and a souvening of the unforgotten photographer Carlo di Palma with the documentary "Water & Sugar: Carlo Di Palma The Colours of Life" directed by Fariborz Kamkari and produced by Di Palma's wife Adriana Chiesa Di Palma.

The big playwright Eduardo de Filippo was honored with the screening of the movie "The Mayor of Rione Sanità," a modern adapation of Di Filippo's theatre piece of the same name which narrates a crime story set against the backdrop of Naples. The film was directed by Mario Martone and premiered in US and Italy by its

2021 was a year defined by fear and pain. However, in the midst of the devastating effects of the COVD-19 pandemic, the Capri in the World Institute led the way in safely reopening US theatres to Italian film. From April 18th-24th of last year, Hollywood's renowned Chinese Theater welcomed the 16th edition of the Los Angeles, Italia festival. Hosted by "Green Book" Oscar winner Nick Vallelonga and Italian-Canadian producer Andrew Iervolino, the event proudly featured the most exciting movies of a season tormented by lockdowns, closed theaters, and isolation.

Once again, the staging of Los Angeles, Italia heralded the international film industry's most anticipated event of the year: The Academy Awards. In advance of Hollywood's "Big Night," the festival featured a wealth of filmmakers and artists who presented their work to the audience at one of the world's premier venues. COVID restrictions meant the absence of the usual crowds and packed red carpet. However, for those honored guests in attendance, the festival showcased some of the industry's most exciting new works, including Edoardo Ponti's "The Life Ahead," a project that not only won a Best Song Oscar nod for Diane Warren and Laura Pausini's "Seen," but also marked the comeback of the legendary Sophia Loren. Though the festival missed many friends who were unable to travel, those who could not attend in person were given the opportunity to follow Los Angeles, Italia '21 on social media and take part through the festival's official online platforms. The vast array of prestigious guests who participated virtually included screenwriter and director Aaron Sorkin, nominated for "The Trial of the Chicago 7"; Dante Ferretti and Francesca Lo Schiavo; directors Bille August, Terry Gilliam, Bobby Moresco, Giorgio Diritti and Marco Pontecorvo; as well as actors Kabir Bedi, Joseph Fiennes, Jack Huston, Gina Gershon, Joe Mantegna, Rocio Munoz Morales, Luca Barbareschi, Pietro Chiambretti, Francesco Baccini, Paolo Buonvino, Remo Girone and Valeria Altobelli.

2022 The 17th edition of the Los Angeles, Italia festival fell during a peculiar time in the history of international relationships, at the onset of a cruel and merciless conflict between Russia and Ukraine that has been generating feelings of preoccupation and disconcert throughout the world. Despite the alarming

international situation, Italy was able to celebrate its three Academy Award nominees who were acclaimed far and wide by global audiences and film markets; three talents who embody the ultimate example of how art encourages interaction, and who once again have become symbols of how Italy is constantly able to deliver genius-like performances and conquer the international scene.

Paolo Sorrentino, an Oscar recipient for "The Great Beauty," ran again last year for "Best International Film" with the most intimate and personal work of his career, "The Hand of God." Another Italian creation with typical Italian settings and quotes was an animated feature nominated at the 2022 Academy Awards: Pixar-produced "Luca," a nostalgic look at the childhood places and times of its author Enrico Casarosa, the first Italian to ever direct for the celebrated and beloved Disney-owned animation studio.

And last but not least, costume designer Massimo Cantini Parrini – also known as the "fashion archeologist," – obtained his second Oscar nomination for "Cyrano," a film adaptation based on Emile Rostand's comedy and inspired by Erica Schmidt's musical, for director Joe Wright.

The world movie capital city paid tribute to Vittorio Gassman on the centenary of his birth as well as to Dante Spinotti, undisputed legend of big screen photography. It also hosted some of the most interesting Italian movies recently made and starring both accomplished and up-and-coming Italian performers like Riccardo Scamarcio and Benedetta Porcaroli, Alessandro Pondi and Michele Ragno, Gabriella

Over the course of the weeks preceding the Academy Awards ceremony, a number of guests joined the Los Angeles Italia 2023 festival, including screenwriter and director Mike White (presenting the TV series "The White Lotus,") and film director Ferzan Ozpetek, whose movies were honored with a retrospective; Pippo Mezzapesa with his "Burning Hearts;" Carlo Carlei; Paolo Genovese; Italian Oscar nominees Alice Rohrwacher (with her short movies "Le pupille") and Aldo Signoretti (makeup artist for "Elvis"). Both Rohrwacher and Signoretti received recognition by the Italian Cultural Institute Los Angeles.















A FAMILY MOVIE DYNASTY

oppola's recurring concept of the nuclear family in his movies may be explained by his biography. Eleanor, his wife of 50 years, is an artist and a filmmaker. His younger sister, Talia Shire, is a celebrated performer. His grandchildren Nicholas Cage, Mark "the Cope" Coppola, Jason Coppola and Robert Schwartzman excel as actors, screenwriters and musicians. His children Roman and Sofia are acclaimed film directors. In 2003, Sofia inaugurated the third generation of the family to be presented with an Oscar for "Lost in Translation."

The story of the Coppola dynasty is deeply intertwined with the world of cinema, and it all started with Francis' father, Carmine Coppola, whose dream was to become a music composer. At the age of 14, Francis sent his father a fake telegram inviting him to compose the music score for a movie. However, this deception was followed by an actual event that took place several years later when Francis recruited Carmine - and this time for real - to score "The Godfather." Carmine Coppola continued composing the music for Francis' crime saga and eventually won an Oscar for Best Original Score for "The Godfather Part II." Today Coppola's fourth generation is becoming established thanks to talented Gia Coppola, daughter of Francis' firstborn Giancarlo, who sadly lost his life in a speedboating accident.

The Italian American director will soon release his much-anticipated new movie, inspired by the Roman Empire and set in a dystopian future


Coppola's next movie "Megalopolis" represents an epic challenge that required years of hard work, personal involvement and a level of stress that would crush most filmmakers, but that the big Italian American director is perfectly able to cope with.

An intense film adaptation to most likely be presented at the next edition of the Cannes Film Festival, "Megalopolis" blends Republican Rome with a dystopian futuristic setting, taking inspiration from the Roman conspiracy between senator Lucius Sergius Catilina and Marcus Tullius Cicero. The film tells the story of a young and ambitious architect (played by Adam Driver) who wants to rebuild New York City as a utopia following a devastating disaster. A young woman who is in love with him confronts her reactionary and conservative father, a powerful man who opposes any changes.

Coppola's ambition on "Megalopolis" isn't to put more Oscars on his mantelpiece, but to make a movie with the utmost freedom, almost a final artistic legacy of an author who has always struggled to affirm his ideas. He sold some of his winery holdings to get a credit line to cover the costs of this dream project, and his hope is to leave behind another film that continues to challenge viewers long after he passes away. "My first goal was to make a love story with heart, but then you realize it's about love and disloyalty and every aspect of human life," he said. "It echoes many other aspects of human life, like our planet being in danger."

The film has brought together an exciting cast of stars: along with Driver, we have Audrey Plaza, Giancarlo Esposito, Laurence Fishburne, Forest Whitaker, Dustin Hoffman, Chloe Fineman, Shia LaBeouf, Talia Shire, Nathalie Emmanuel, Jason Schwartzman and Jon Voight.





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ENIGMA ROL

Director and screenwriter Anselma Dell'Olio and co-screenwriter and artistic producer Alessio De Leonardis tell the story of one of the most controversial and fascinating figures of the 20th century


Through testimonials, archival material, photographs, archival videos, and scenic reconstructions, "Enigma Rol" is at the same time a portrait, an investigation, and an anthology of the character, personality, and works of the controversial psychic from Turin, Gustavo Adolfo Rol (1903-1994). Gustavo Rol was born in the early 20th century into a high bourgeois family in Turin. Guided by the imposing, authoritarian, and highly critical figure of his father (one of the

founders of Banca Commerciale Italiana), he embarked on a banking career, which he abandoned immediately after his father's death. He began to dedicate himself, and continued to do so for the rest of his life, to his true interests: music. art, antiquities, and, above all, the "paranormal," a term he vehemently repudiated. Gustavo Rol rejected every esoteric label. It was during a stay in France, when he was just twenty, that he realized he had "abilities," as he called them. He could read deeply into people, grasp their essence, soul, thoughts, and sorrows. He sensed strong feelings that led him to diagnose illnesses and prevent disastrous events with unsettling precision. He often received his guests in his living room but also in other people's homes, outdoors, in hotels, in casinos, in clinics, where he regularly visited the sick. He chose who could participate in his experimental evenings because, by his own admission, the phenomena he produced did not develop on command; the right atmosphere had to be created. This is one of the essential points fueling the controversies of those who never believed in him. Those who always saw in him only a

Gustavo Rol made many people partake in his wonders, and even today, they recount marvels and inexplicable phenomena. To shed light on this inexplicable yet fascinating and mysterious figure, terms like "paranormal," "extrasensory," or "parapsychological" are not sufficient. Throughout his life, he was much more. Some called him a "mediocre illusionist" (Piero Angela and other skeptics), while others said he was a top-tier illusionist (Francesco Maria Mugnai). And then there are direct witnesses who passionately and with firsthand knowledge claim that he was an unintentional spiritual master, an Enlightened being sent to Earth to make us better, or simply

an extraordinary, special, unique man with mysterious and incredible abilities (Rol never referred to them as "powers"). He was encountered and appreciated by Charles De Gaulle, John F. Kennedy, Jacqueline Kennedy, Franco Zeffirelli, Federico Fellini, Vittorio Valletta, Cesare Romiti, Gianni Agnelli, many members of the FIAT leadership, Sergio Rossi, Jean Cocteau, Adriana Asti, Valentina Cortese, Giorgio Strehler, Vittorio Gassman, Luciana Frassati Gawronska, and many other well-known and lesser-known figures, as well as a vast number of ordinary people.

Produced by Francesca Verdini and co-produced by Pietro Peligra and Agostino Saccà, "Enigma Rol" is a production by La Casa Rossa with Rai Cinema, in co-production with RS Productions and Pepito Produzioni, and in association with Luce Cinecittà.

Being RICHARD DREYFUSS

The American actor who received an Academy Award for "The Goodbye Girl" is one of the most versatile and poignant performers in Hollywood

Born in New York in 1947, Richard Dreyfuss grew up surrounded by artists, his mother, brother and uncle being actors. His big screen debut dates back to a small part in Mike Nichols' "The Graduate" and soon afterwards he caught audiences' attention with the role of Baby Face Nelson in John Milius's directorial debut, "Dillinger."

Dreyfuss owes his breathrough to George Lucas' "American Graffiti," a fun yet melancholic coming of age story set in the '60s, where he delivered an intense performance praised by critics and audiences.

But Dreyfuss' career really took off with the sensational success of Steven Spielberg's "Jaws," in which he played Hooper, the oceanographer engaged in a terrifying close encounter with a giant shark; and it was consolidated later in 1977 with "Close Encounters of the Third Kind," also by Spielberg, and in Herbert Ross' "The Goodbye Girl," a comedy written and scripted by Neil Simon, whose performance earned him an Oscar for Best Actor. It was precisely through Spielberg that Dreyfuss revealed his incredible acting skills to the masses, becoming a symbol of acting creativity and versatility. His grasp of the characters was further refined until he became one of Hollywood's most sought after and vital performers.

MAX NARCISO

CHARACTER DESIGNER FOR THE NOMINEE "WAR IS OVER!"

The Olympus of the Oscar nominees includes the animated short, "War is Over!" created by the Italian character designer Max Narciso. A tribute to peace in a world where wars continue to rage, the genesis for the short was the wish of Sean Ono Lennon, son to John Lennon and Yoko Ono, to make a music video for one of the most famous songs of his parents, "Happy Xmas." Narciso lives in Los Angeles,

where he gained recognition for his character design work in comics, particularly for his contributions to Disney graphic novels like "Nightmare Before Christmas," "Alice in Wonderland," "Frozen," "Lilo and Stitch," to mention a few. He has worked on preproduction for animation with major companies such as Disney, Warner Bros, Laika, Paramount and Skydance, and currently works as lead character designer at Netflix Animation.





MASSIMO ZERI DIRECTOR OF PHOTOGRAPHY

Director of Photography Massimo Zeri is an Italian artist who was cast to work in "Sweetwater," the story of the first African American to sign a contract with NBA, forever changing the way basketball was played. Massimo Zeri, born in Rome, Italy, started shooting short films at the age of 12 with his father's 8mm camera. He attended the "Roberto

With ever-growing product demand from global buyers and a financial crisis generated by the Covid-19 pandemic affecting the entire audiovisual sector, the 2024 edition will offer areas of discussion and knowledge-generating, high-profile exchange opportunities, both online and in person. Form may change, but not substance.

After the long lockdown, movie theaters have finally reopened and welcomed back viewers. 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


AND THE DRAMA OF CHILD MARRIAGES ARE FEATURED IN "THE GOAT"

Amr Saad is the protagonist of a new movie by Ilaria Borrelli, a story of denunciation and emancipation featuring an incredible international cast

Films can offer an important opportunity to discuss the human condition and the discrimination perpetrated in far too many areas of the world.

During the "LA, Italia" festival a number of topical and eye-opening subjects will be tackled to shed light on the troubled lives of millions of men and women.

Italian director Ilaria Borrelli has long been committed to giving voice to children living in difficult situations: "Talking to the Trees," directed in 2012, reveals the drama of Cambodian child prostitutes. "The Goat," the first big Arabian international production helmed by a Western woman, denounces child marriage and the abuses suffered by minor spouses. In war-torn areas marked by violence and deprivation, little girls are some of the most helpeless victims of a true humanitarian tragedy. Sold as wives, they are forbidden any education and access to health care, and they are exposed to sexual explotation. The film, successfully presented at the Rome Film festival and at Capri Hollywood, features Egyptian actor Amr Saad, a true star in the Mediterranean. Often referred to as the "Arabian Tom Cruise," Saad showed his striking talent and remarkable stage presence in the movie "Al Madina" by Yusra Nasrallah and was acclaimed by critics for "Dikan Shehata," and the TV series "Kingdom of the Mountain," "Younis Born Silver" and "Security Situation." Amr Saad was awarded at the Alexandria Film Festival for his performance in the movie "Maulana." "The Goat" has been a good opportunity for the actor to stress the importance of cinema in dealing with all kind of subjects, even the hot and thorny issues. Gender equality, the right to education and women's empowerment are all are topics that can no longer be ignored on the agenda of both eastern and western societies.

THE WALK OF THE "LEARNED DONKEYS"

Calento, May 2021. Covid 19 restrictions having been loosened, a group of musicians led by the donkey Bartolo, sets out on a 200 kilometer walk along the

Via Francigena from Torre Guaceto (Brindisi) to Santa Maria di Leuca (Lecce). On the journey, the "Company of the Learned Donkeys" has the opportunity to meet a number of characters who have become keepers of a memory in danger of being lost. The anecdotes, rites and traditions of Salento's popular culture are narrated by the laid-back attitude of the donkey Bartolo. Salento is a historical and geographical place where Europe ends or begins, depending on your point of view. The name Salento is derived from the Latin "a salo," meaning people who meet at sea. The choice of this specific stretch of road is no coincidence: It reflects a deep rooted legacy unwinding through towns, historic villages, ecosystems and monumental emergencies.





MADRE SONNO

A journey through the daily mystery of sleep, illustrated in three extraordinary stories about ordinary people. Their adventures reveal the multiple aspects of the act of sleeping, intimately connected to our lives and immeasurably important to our well-being, and they open unexpected, dramatic and fascinating scenarios.



OF SARAJEVO

The documentary tells the extraordinary story of Sanja and Zoran, who in 1993 fled and survived the siege of Sarajevo, the longest war siege of the 20th century, to find refuge in Italy. After 30 years they return to Sarajevo, together with the woman who welcomed them in her home, in a small mountain village. "We met Sanja and Zoran in the mountain village where I live, just before the start of the war in Ukraine," said the directors Fabiana Antonioli and Andrea D'Arrigo. "We wanted to make this film to show, to those who have never experienced a war, what it is like to live under constant bombardment. And to honor those who fought back in every war: helping refugees, opening their homes to them, working as photojournalists. All of us can do something: that is the message of "The Breath of Sarajevo."




MOLISE "HAPPY TROPIC"

Molise is one of the smallest Italian regions. People say that it doesn't exist. In effect, it does exist in space, not in time. Not in 2023. An uncontaminated, rural land that has quietly hidden itself from the eye of the modern world's storm.

The narration traverses four villages with many lifestyles, four tribes, starting from a small village that lives poised between poetry and death. Then it passes through Roccamandolfi, showing a man who is part brigand, part Mohican, and part cowboy. Then it reaches a medieval Albanian fiefdom. Here, the heirs of Prince Skandemberg

compete each year in a wild race in ox-drawn carts. At last, we come to Cvtà, a village that was almost abandoned but has been rescued by street artists from all over the world. Because, as one graffiti artist says, "Molise doesn't exist, it resists." Luigi Grispello was born in Naples, but has always lived in Rome. He went to classical high school, where he studied literature, Latin and ancient Greek. He graduated with a degree in Letters from La Sapienza, with a thesis on Fellini's literary influences. Two years later, again at La Sapienza, he graduated in Cinema with a thesis on the influence of the satirical newspaper on twentieth-century Italian cinema. "Happy Tropic" is his debut film.



Through his unique, passionate yet spiritual style melding a deep-rooted nostalgia for his rustic origin with an unconditional love for blues, Zucchero Sugar Fornaciari is winning audiences over worldwide

With sixty million records sold, Zucchero Fornaciari is one of the most popular artists of Italian music, especially beloved for the way he is able to combine the most characteristic American music traditions like gospel and blues with the regional sounds of his land of origin, Emilia Romagna, thus venturing out into a risky yet extremely original and successful idea. Though 'blues' was traditionally defined as the devil's music, Adelmo Fornaciari - Zucchero's real name - started playing in a church where he was allowed to practice on an organ, as he could not afford to buy an instrument. He started out in the Seventies amidst many difficulties, but his career took off in the late Eighties thanks to his album "Oro, incenso e birra" selling eight million copies and featuring innovative tracks mixing pop, rock and R&B. Zucchero left his mark all over the world with a number of unforgettable performances and collaborations with such iconic artists as Eric Clapton, Miles Davis, B.B. King, Sting, Bono Vox, Andrea Bocelli, Paul Young, Sheryl Crow, Luciano Pavarotti, becoming one of the most acclaimed R&B Italian artists. Honored with many acknowledgments including a Grammy and a World Music Award, Zucchero is also known for being a charitable artist involved in many high profile music events, including: "Freddie Mercury Tribute" (1992) where he was the only Italian artist to perform at London's Wembley Stadium; "Pavarotti & Friends," "Rainforest Fund" and "Italia Loves Romagna;" last but not least he took part in the single "Domani" with other Italian colleagues to raise funds for the areas hit and the people displaced by the earthquake of L'Aquila in 2009.





Back at the LA, Italia Festival, the Venetian filmmaker will present his latest film to American audiences — a tale about a painful subject: abductions for ransom, which has plagued Italian society for more than two decades

Dennis Dellai, 62, was born in Vicenza, Italy. He is the editor-in-chief at the Giornale di Vicenza and a filmmaker, having directed three feature films, two short films, and a docufiction so far.

His first film was "Terre Rosse" (Red Lands) released in 2008, set during World War II. A man and a woman meet in a railway station during the Nazi occupation in 1944. This is the start of a touching love affair during the Resistance, an impossible relationship between a young teacher and a brilliant Fascist Ministry official. The war will shatter their certainties and mark their destinies. In 2016 Dellai directed his second film, "Oscar", dedicated to the life of the Austrian Jewish musician Oscar Klein, who survived deportation by the Nazis thanks to a partisan organization. A young Jewish musician in confinement in Alto Vicentino wins the friendship of the community in which he is forced to live. He bonds especially with the Podesta's two children, Emma and Vittorio, and successfully joins the band directed by Don Franco, the town's parish priest. After September 8 and the ensuing German occupation, Oscar and his family are forced to flee. With the help of Emma and Don Franco, they manage to get in touch with a partisan organization that will help them to reach salvation by crossing the Swiss border through many whirlwind adventures. His latest film, "800 Giorni", is inspired by the longest kidnapping in Italian history, that of Carlo Celadon, who was abducted by the 'Ndrangheta in 1988 and released after 831 days. Kidnappings scarred and troubled Italian society between the late 1980s and the 1990s. During those years dozens of people from well off families were kidnapped by criminal organizations for the purpose of obtaining money from their dear ones. Some of them never returned. "800 Giorni" has received the 2023 Glass Lion award in Venice, the Cult Movie Award at Capri-Hollywood, the Art Award at the Film and Food Festival in Sorrento, and is officially in contention at the 2024 David di Donatello Award.



being awaited at home by his parents, distressed and uncertain whether to rely on the state (represented by an inflexible magistrate and a



Introducing FRANCESCO MANDELLI

The politically incorrect but genuine irony of a versatile artist who, teaming up once again with his longtime partner Fabrizio Biggio, presents iconic characters who ridicule the vices and hypocrisies of Italians

Actor, director, writer, TV and radio host, Francesco Mandelli has been interested in the entertainment world since he was a teenager, when he began auditioning for various shows. In 1998, one of these led him to co-host MTV Italia's "Tokusho" with Andrea Pezzi.

Mandelli became known to the public as "Nongio," short for "Nongiovane" (not young,) Andrea Pezzi's nickname for him during the program. Despite this funny nickname, Mandelli did many "young" things—like joining the music group Orange as a vocalist and guitarist; working as a radio presenter until MTV launched him as a VJ in such programs as "Sushi" "Select," "MTV on the Beach," "Romalive" with Mao, "MTV Mad" with Gip, and especially with Fabrizio Biggio, his best friend and inseparable colleague. In 1999, Mandelli made his feature film debut in the comedy "All the Moron's Men." He was cast by Lucio Pellegrini for "Ora o Mai Più," Giovanni Veronesi for "Manuale d'amore," and Massimo Venier for "Generation 1000 Euro."

With Fabrizio Biggio, Mandelli created the sketch-comedy "I soliti idioti" filled with surreal and grotesque characters struggling with the world around them. The success of the TV show prompted them to present their characters in a feature film released in 2011 with the same title as the show. The success of the movie was replicated two years later with a sequel. Mandelli went on working for the cinema with such prominent directors as Fausto Brizzi, Neri Parenti, Volfano de Blasi and Francesco Patierno. In 2014 Mandelli published his first book, "Osnangeles," a collection of short stories about the province where he grew up, and in November 2018 his second book was out with the title "My Daughter is a Spaceship." That same year, Mandelli debuted on stage with a monologue written by American playwright Will Eno called "Title and Deed." In 2018, he directed a movie revolving around the theme of teen bullying, "Well but Not Well," which was presented at the Rome Film Festival. In 2023, the Mandelli-Biggio pair got back together with a theater tour followed by the film "The

Usual Idiots 3 - The Return," twelve years after the last chapter.



Somewhere between dream and delirium, thriller and melodrama, "Mimi-Prince of Darkness" tells how love and sweetness survive in a cruel and strange world.

Mimì, a young pizza maker who is brutally bullied due to a foot defect, falls for Carmilla, a 'goth' teenager convinced she is a descendant of Count Dracula.

First-time director Brando De Sica, grandson to Vittorio De Sica, has opted for Naples, a city usually known for its sunny view and its glorious sea, to host the obscure and gloomy locations featured in his horror movie. But it's also true that Naples offers an original, timeless atmosphere shrouded in arcane mysteries, including the figure of the alchemist prince of San Severo. An avid fan of vampire movies, Brando De Sica has handled every single detail of his movie, from drawing the storyboard to selecting the music tracks (with songs by De Andrè and Sergio Bruni) and casting the two young leads: 15-year-old Sara Ciocca, who despite her young age has already appeared in various film and TV productions; and Domenico Cuomo, rising star of the acclaimed TV series "Mare fuori."



With a passionate yet objective eye, British filmmaker Trudie Styler has met the challenge of creating a documentary whose purpose is to highlight the contrasts of Naples, its beauty, its painful realities, its dazzling light, and its darkest secrets. By letting its people tell their own story, she reveals a proud and generous population and a welcoming yet pitiless metropolis.

The documentary features interviews with Don Antonio Loffredo, a rebel and "enlightened" parish priest of the Sanità city district; actor Francesco Di Leva, the founder of Teatro NEST at San Giovanni a Teduccio; the writer Roberto Saviano; the street artist Jorit; the musician Clementino, whose song "Neapolis" is also featured in the film; and housewives, artisans, shop owners and peddlers, who provide their testimony as keepers of traditions and ancient trades. Thanks to the warm and suffused lighting by Dante Spinotti, Styler looks at Naples through the same romantic lens as the poets and intellectuals who used to visit the city during the Grand Tour. Styler's documentary presents Naples as a 107-minute-long kaleidoscope of love.



Emerging from a complicated time in his life, actor and entrepreneur Edoardo Costa is back on the big screen, proving his talent in action movies, rom coms and Italian indie productions

The Italian actor, businessman and former model Edoardo Costa is one of the most popular faces on TV. Born in Varese in 1967, after graduating in Philosophy, Costa was discovered by a talent scout from the Why Not Models agency, which hired him as a photo story actor and model. This is how Costa started working for a number of top brands including Giorgio Armani, Christian Dior, Missoni, Gianni Versace and Calvin Klein. The ensuing whirlwind career led him to Milan, Paris, New York and Los Angeles, a city which he fell in love with and made his home. Since the beginning Costa expressed an aspiration to become an actor and in 1988, he made his film debut with a small role in "Human Error." Thanks to his good looks and his incredible determination, Costa was also able to earn a few small parts in US television productions, including two hit series, "Baywatch" and "Arliss."

Ten years after his debut Costa was cast in the soap opera "Un posto al sole," one of the most acclaimed and longstanding Italian TV shows. In the following years, Costa balanced himself between Italy - where he worked on the TV series "Un medico in famiglia" and "Distretto di polizia" - and the US, where he appeared in the soap opera "The Bold and the Beautiful."

In 2001, Costa earned a part that turned him into an audience favorite, incarnating Riccardo Moretti in the soap opera "Vivere," where he worked until 2005. In 2006, Costa was back on the big screen with the movie "Notte prima degli esami" and after that he worked opposite Bruce Willis in the action movie "Live Free or Die Hard." In 2007, Costa took over the fashion agency Beatrice International Models together with the models Iman and Stephanie Seymour and inaugurated an acting school, The Actor's Academy, in Milan. In 2008, Costa played a key role in "Down the Shore" alongside James Gandolfini and since then he regularly worked for the US film industry, appearing as Colonel Tanelli in "The Black Tulip (2010); in "Non-Stop" with Julianne Moore (2013); and in "General Commander" opposite Steven Seagal (2019).

After taking some personal time out of the limelight, Edoardo Costa is back on track. He now lives in the US, dividing his time between Los Angeles and Miami. His new job as a life coach has certainly not been a reason for neglecting the movies: He worked on "The Island" incarnating a merciless villain; the romantic comedy "Christmas in the Caribbean" with Elizabeth Hurley, and the Italian independent movie "Leggende metropolitane" directed by first-timer Stefano Meloncelli.



A made-for-tv special tells the story of a young man of the 1800s, imbued with enthusiasm, who fought to defend his fatherland and pursue a shared dream of a united country

Every Italian knows the words to their National Anthem, but only a few know the story of the great man who composed it: Goffredo Mameli, a poet and a hero of the Risorgimento, the 19th-century ideological and literary movement that culminated Italy's unification in the 1860s. Mameli's life was brief yet full of passion, and he stands as a symbol of unity thanks to his drive and his ability to stir the feelings of all Italians to reach their coveted freedom and unification.

To tell Mameli's enthralling story, Rai has crafted a miniseries titled "Mameli - Il ragazzo che sognò l'Italia," directed by Luca Lucini and

The series delves into two specific years in the life of young Mameli, a time scarred by wars but enriched by a widespread sentiment for politics, seen reflected in his poetry along with his lived experience of love, friendship, and painful betrayals. But above all it is the story of a young man with a heart full of timeless ideals and an eye to the future.

Mameli left his home town of Genoa with three hundred volunteers and headed north to Milan to provide support during the Five Days of Milan in 1848, when the population rebelled against the Austrian regime.

It was at this point that Mameli became a symbol of true fervor. Young people looked up to him, and women fell in love with him, as the miniseries shows.

His short life was full of dreams, self-deception, inspiring ideals and noble utopias. The story shows how the Song of Italians was composed and how this anthem was meant to highlight and celebrate the birth of a country. The story also shows the first time the song was sung in Genoa in 1947, during a memorial attended by over 30,000 patriots standing against the Habsburgs: everyone sang it - men, women and children all together, even the illiterate.

The film goes on narrating how Mameli met other prominent individuals of his

time including his fellow citizen Nino Bixio, as well as Giuseppe Mazzini and Giuseppe Garibaldi, two fundamental personalities for Italian unification.




