or the eighth year running, Intesa Sanpaolo - the reference bank for Italian cinema and promoter of L "Made in Italy", the Italian image and culture abroad - renews its support for the Los Angeles Italia Festival, now in its 20th edition and organised by the Capri nel Mondo Institute with the support of the Ministry of Culture, the patronage of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation, the Ministry of Business and Made in Italy and the Ministry of Tourism and the participation of the Consulate General of Italy in Los Angeles, the Italian Cultural Institute, Ice and Enit.

Raffaella De Laurentiis is an Italia producer and the daughter of two legends of the film industry: Dino De Laurentiis and actress Silvana Mangano. After initially studing achitecture, she started at a very young age to work as property master and set designer on her father's productions. Her first important job came in 1973 as an assistant costume designer in Luchino Visconti's "Ludwig." Raffaella, however, realized that her talent would be best expressed in helming the production and organization of a movie. She worked as a production assistant on "Hurricane" before taking on the role of producer at Dino De Laurentiis Productions.


One of her first major successes was "Conan the Barbarian," a film adaptation of the hero created in the 1930s by pulp writer Robert E. Howard. The film blended fantasy with adventure cinema, retrieved the Myths of Antiquity by projecting them into a futuristic universe, but above all it launched Arnold Schwarzenegger's career as an actor and an icon of 1980s action movies.

More ill-fated was the box-office outcome of "Dune," directed by David Lynch, with whom Dino and Raffaella De Laurentiis brought to the screen the novel that Frank Herbert published in 1965 and which is still regarded as one of the milestones of literary science fiction and beyond. After leaving her father's production company, Raffaella set out on her own, handling numerous projects: "Prancer", a Christmas story about a little girl, sad and withdrawn because of her mother's death, who finds a hurt reindeer in the woods and nurtures it; "Dragonheart," a fantasy film series set in the Middle Ages that follows the adventures of several dragons willing to share their hearts with a human being; "Kull the Conqueror," about the vicissitudes of a barbarian warrior who, thanks to his skill and courage, becomes a king, fighting against evil; "Backdraft," an action-thriller with dramatic elements set in the world of firefighters and directed by Ron Howard; and "The Forbidden Kingdom," an exciting mix of adventure, irony and a coming-of-age story that for the first time brings two Asian film stars together on the big screen: Jackie Chan and Jet Li.

ON SET, the new section of Italy for Movies - portal for locations and production incentives promoted by General Directorate of Cinema and Audiovisual of the Ministry of Culture (DGCA-MiC) and created by Cinecittà in collaboration with the association of Italian Film Commissiones association of Italian Film Commissions - marks the first initiative to comprehensi-

vely map all the sets active in Italy at any given time, offering useful information on the status of film and audiovisual production in the country that improves transparency and contributes to enhancing the territory's visibility and attractiveness from an audiovisual and cinematographic perspective. «A flexible tool for analyzing and monitoring the film and audiovisual sector which contributes to the growth of the industry, a goal that the DGCA has always pursued» said Nicola Borrelli Director-General for Cinema and Audiovisual «A strategic database providing reliable, organized information that is finally available, public and transparent, will help increase knowledge of industry activities, both from a production and employment perspective» noted Chiara Sbarigia, President of Cinecittà.

CULTURAL AND CREATIVE ENTERPRISES WILL BE CREATED TO SUSTAIN GROWTH

The Undersecretary of State to the Ministry of Culture offers ideas, projects and resources to inject new life into the entertainment industry and to internationalize Italian filmmaking

New methods and conditions have been introduced to modernize cultural and creative initiatives. Undersecretary Lucia Borgonzoni, in reference to the decree signed by the Ministry of Culture and the Ministry of Enterprises and Made in Italy to implement Article 25 declared, "This is a milestone in stabilizing the value of the supply chain in order to support its growth. This is a process that with funds allocated by the NRRP (National Recovery and Resilience Plan) for a digital and green transition - organizes provisions for the valorization, promotion and security of Made in Italy."

"Entities eligible for Cultural and Creative Enterprise ("CCE") status," explained Undersecretary Borgonzoni, "include Third Sector entities, innovative startups and self-employed professionals involved in the conception, creation, production, development, dissemination, promotion, conservation, research, valorization and management of cultural goods, activities and products. The decree also includes an important innovation: The attainment of CCE status will occur as a result of registration in a Special Section of the Business Registry. Finally, I'd like to mention a measure that I particularly care about, which is an interministerial decree establishing a contribution of three million euros a year to promote and support investments made by CCEs in the national territory as part of the strategy implemented by the Ministry of Culture."

Undersecretary Borgonzoni concluded, "A decree will follow to establish a Registry of Cultural and Creative Enterprises of National Interest at the Ministry

An increasing number of artists and majors are eager to take part in the Los Angeles, Italia Film Fashion and Art Fest. The event, along with its two 'sister festivals' - Capri Hollywood International Film Festival and the Ischia Global Fest – have been able to strengthen a metaphorical bridge between Italy and Hollywood. Alongside Italy's traditional cultural locations such as Venice and Rome, for many years the Gulf of Naples has hosted two exciting festivals attended by movie fans and award-winning celebrities. For many filmmakers and performers, our festivals have been a

launching pad for The Golden Globes and the Academy Awards. This has been true for Paolo Sorrentino, Michel Hazanavicius, Jeoffrey Rush, Forest Whitaker, Helen Mirren, Alicia Vikander and Melissa Leo, who first were honored in Italy and a few weeks later at the Oscars.

summer Ischia Global highlighted the explosive strength of Karla Sofia Gascon for her leading role in "Emilia Perèz" (a frontrunner with 13 nominations), and two years ago the festival presented the promising Brady Corbet and Mona Fastvold, who would soon burst out on the international scene with nominations for the powerful "The Brutalist," Capri, Hollywood has recently bet on the following pictures: Sean Baker's bitter comedy "Anora;" the body horror film "The Substance," which marked Demi Moore's rebirth; the captivating moral thriller by Edward Berger "Conclave;" animated fairy tales "The Wild Robot" and "Wallace & Gromit: Vengeance Most Fowl."

And now the great night of the Academy Awards is virtually upon us. HONORS HER LEGENDARY PARENTS

«When I was young, I was always identified as the daughter of Ingrid Bergman and Roberto Rossellini. Now that I'm older, this happens less frequently; and I miss it, especially today.

Isabella is the daughter of multiple-Oscar-winning actress Ingrid Bergman and the world renowned Italian neorealistic filmmaker Roberto Rossellini ("Rome, Open City," "Journey to Italy"), also an Oscar nominee for Best Original Screenplay, for "Paisan. Born in Rome of the much talked about relationship between Ingrid Bergman and Roberto Rossellini, the world of cinema had been a natural atmosphere for Isabella from the beginning, and the family trade. Her mother, the legendary Swedish actress that Hollywood captured in numerous romantic

roles, was directed by Michael

Curtiz ("Casablanca"), George Cukor ("Gaslight") and Alfred

Roberto Rossellini, was acclaimed for his focus on Italian post-war everyday life depicting intense and heartbreaking universal feelings.



WITH THE LIFETIME **ACHIEVEMENT OSCAR®**

Nearly four decades after David Lynch's "Blue Velvet" made her a star, the Italian grand dame is finally getting her due from the Academy, for her role as Sister Agnes in Edward Berger's Vatican-set thriller "CONCLAVE."

Cister Agnes is a silent woman, yet she's able to stand up to a group of esteemed Cardinals with words as sharp as blades. In "Conclave" – a political-religious thriller where high priests are involved in heated debate as they gather in Rome for the election of a new Pope - Rossellini's character stands out for her discreet yet authoritative position in a world of men. Traditionally excluded from the power games, the head nun nevertheless plays a decisive role when a new leader is selected, affecting the future of the Church.

German director Edward Berger helmed the drama based on the novel with the same name, by Robert Harris. It stars the 72-year-old Italian actress in one of the most acclaimed roles of her life, and earned her her first Oscar nomination ever, as Best Supporting Actress. Fifty years ago her mother – the legendary Ingrid Bergman - was on her third Academy Award for her role in "Murder on the Orient Express."

Isabella Rossellini's professional rebirth started a year and a half ago with her participation in "La Chimera," written and directed by Alice Rohrwacher, In it, Isabella gives life - in her unique way - to the character of the eccentric Flora, the mother of the deceased fianceé of grave robber Arthur, incarnated by Josh

From journalism to fashion, from the movies to a love for animals and a life immersed in nature, Rossellini never stops being a symbol of modern elegance and timeless charm, of female irony, intelligence, curiosity, as well as incarnating the strength of being able to change and evolve throughout her life and career. After her film debut in the Tavianis' sentimental drama "The Meadow," which earned her a Silver Ribbon Award as Best New Actress, she was captured by Hollywood, which knew she had the qualities of a star. Isabella played the role of Dorothy Vallens, the tragic and mysterious chanteuse in David Lynch's "Blue Velvet" - a movie that has become a landmark of modern American filmmaking. She went on to portray the cold and charming Lisle von Rhuman, the woman who possesses the secret eternal youth filter in Robert Zemeckis's black comedy "Death Becomes Her;" and Maria, a romantic heroine torn between two men in John Schlesinger's movie set during the Cold War, "The Innocent." Isabella worked with Peter Weir, Abel Ferrara, Nikita Mikalchov, James Gray, Denis Villeneuve and Lawrence Kasdan, to name a few.

A strong, extroverted, passionate woman with a thousand interests, Isabella Rossellini's appearances on the big and small screens, as well as on the covers of sophisticted magazines, have always been a hailed as a reminder of her free spirited talent and timeless beauty.

HER FUTURE BETWEEN FILMS AND MUSIC

From pop star to movie diva: Ariana Grande continues to explore the entertainment business, seamlessly making her way through hit songs and outstanding film roles, acclaimed by critics and audiences alike. An ex-Disney's starlet, Grande's growing passion for movies matches her musical talent, and has led her to delve into a number of film projects, allowing her to fully express her multi-layered talent. And now, at the peak of her career, Grande is enjoying a 2025 Best Actress Oscar nomination for the role of Glinda, the Good Witch of the South in "Wicked," the film adaptation of the musical with the same name by Winnie Holzman and Steven Schwartz. This acknowledgement adds to an endless list of awards celebrating Grande's outstanding career. Born in Boca Raton, Florida to a family of Sicilian and Abruzzi origins, Grande is one of the most successful pop artists of her time, with over 100 million records sold all over the world. Her every song has gone platinum. As a songwriter, Grande won two Grammy Awards, one BRIT Award, two Billboard Music Awards, and ten MTV Video Music Awards. In 2016 and 2019, Time Magazine selected Ariana Grande as one of the 100 most influential people in the world, and in 2018 she was Billboard Magazine's Woman of the Year. Rolling Stone Magazine included her among the 50 most talented vocal artists in music history. She was the most downloaded artist on Spotify in the 2010s, with the most songs surpassing one billion views.

Adriana Grande will also appear in the upcoming sequel, "Wicked: For Good," whose title is a quote of the most celebrated moments in the famed Broadway show, when Elphaba and Glinda, the story's two protagonists, sing a duet, each describing how their friendship has deeply affected them.

Young Elphaba lives in the land of Oz. For her green skin she is ostracized by the other children, who make fun of her. She befriends another student named Glinda, but the two girls will soon be separated. Glinda's desire for popularity has her seduced by power, while Elphaba's unflinching self-loyalty will produce unexpected and shocking consequences in her future. As they experience incredible ordeals their destinies are fulfilled as Glinda turns into the Good Witch and Elphaba into the Wicked Witch of the West.

A NEW STAR IS BORN

Her first love was ballet, but by age 20, she already knew she wanted to be an actress. This is why Monica Barbaro set out from her birth place San Francisco to work in Hollywood, where she learned the ropes on such hit TV series as "Hawaii Five-0," "Unreal," "Chicago Justice," "The Good Cop," and "FUBAR," playing opposite Arnold Schwarzenegger as his daughter—a secret agent unaware that her father also works for CIA.

In 2022, Monica Barbaro's film debut in "Top Gun: Maverick," as Natasha "Phoenix" Trace—the only female pilot in a world of testosterone—brought her international recognition. The movie marks Tom Cruise's return to the role of US Navy aviator Pete "Maverick" Mitchell—30 years after his legendary performance in "Top Gun," which accelerated his worldwide fame. But she really broke through with James Mangold's "A Complete Unknown," a biopic narrating the rise to stardom of legendary musician Bob Dylan. In the movie, the actress of Italian origin gives life to another music icon, songwriter Joan Baez. When Baez met Dylan (played by Timothée Chalamet), she was already known and often part of the major music festivals of her time. Baez was also interested in new, revolutionary songs and Dylan inspired her to pursue a new music genre. Baez and Dylan were partners in life and work, two soulmates striving for spiritual evolution in an artistic collaboration that went on—with ups and downs—even after their breakup.

Barbaro learned to sing and play the guitar to be able to portray Joan Baez' career in a movie that also depicts her private life, as a woman involved in a love triangle with Dylan/Chalamet and Suze Rotolo/Elle Fanning. Barbaro's performance was recently honored with a well-deserved Oscar nomination for Best Supporting Actress.

Barbaro is now working on "Crime 101," the film adaptation of a novel by Don Winslow, with a stellar cast including Chris Hemsworth, Mark Ruffalo, Barry Keoghan and Halle Berry.

A COMPLETE UNKNOWN

Young Bob Dylan leaves Minnesota for vibrant and tumultuous New York City in 1961, and quickly makes his mark as a talented folk singer, full of personality. The movie tells his story, from his first gigs in small Greenwich Village music clubs to his swift rise to the top of the charts. Thanks to the power of his songs, his dazzling artistic journey expanded beyond the borders of North America to reach worldwide popularity. The film culminates in his groundbreaking electric performance at the Newport Folk Festival in 1965.



He is the most popular living Italian actor in the world, a true film legend who, over the course of an amazing career, tried his hand at all film genres, from Westerns to arthouse movies, from adventure to crime stories, from peplums to war movies. He shared the silver screen with some of the most renowned international stars, including William Holden, Anthony Quinn, Richard Burton, Orson Welles, Yul Brinner, and Catherine Deneuve. He has played a variety of roles, incarnating a Russian, a Pole, a Spanish, a Yankee and a Native American. Thanks to his dashing looks, his dazzling blue eyes, and non-conventional Italian features, he was soon noticed by John Houston, who in 1966 offered him the role of innocent Abel in the blockbuster "The Bible." He soon became the star of mainstream movies, leading his way into all kinds of exotic and metropolitan adventures. Among these, at least two films have become milestones in movie history: Sergio Corbucci's "Django" and Castellari's "Keoma."

But he was also able to delve into more profound and introspective roles, especially

when he starred as the Carabinieri Captain in "The Day of the Owl," based on the celebrated novel by Leonardo Sciascia and directed by Damiano Damiani (who also directed him in other crime movies). On international sets, he delivered intense performances in Bellocchio's "VictoryMarch", Buñuel's "Tristana", Squitieri's "I guappi", GuyHamilton's "Force 10 from Navarone" and Fassbinder's "Querelle de Brest". With a stunning career including over 200 movies, his ageless charm continues to earn him roles in many parts throughout the world. Quentin Tarantino, one his biggest fans, offered him a cameo role in the movie "Django Unchained" — a well-deserved tribute to the actor who has been the "official face" of Django for generations of movie fans, an artist who, according to Tarantino, is "one of the brightest film stars in the world, alongside Clint Eastwood, Charles Bronson and Alain Delon."



She is one of the great Dames of 20th century theatre and cinema: an actress who has always eschewed the trappings of a diva, as she preferred life as a strong-willed, confident and socially committed woman. Born in London, Vanessa Redgrave comes from a family of actors, a tradition started by her grandfather Roy Redgrave (1873–1922). Both her parents (Michael Redgrave and Rachel Kempson) and siblings (Corin and Lynn) were also actors, as well as her children, Joely Richardson and Natasha Richardson, whom she shares with director Tony Richardson. Her son with Franco Nero, Carlo Gabriel, is also a filmmaker. Trained at London's Central School of Speech and Drama, Vanessa Redgrave soon joined the Royal Shakespeare Company where she rose to fame in 1961 playing Rosalind in Shakespeare's comedy "As You Like It."

Her first big film success was Karel Reisz's "Morgan, a Suitable Case for Treatment", followed by Michelangelo Antonioni's "Blow Up". The themes of lack of communication and ambiguity of vision, so dear to the legendary Italian director, found a perfect performer in this enigmatic young woman with strong and beautiful features, able to express herself almost without speaking. Throughout her career, Redgrave played strong women, some real and some

Throughout her career, Redgrave played strong women, some real and some fictional, all gifted with strong personalities and free will.

She was modern dance pioneer Isadora Duncan in "Isadora", the unhappy

Scottish ruler "Mary, Queen of Scots", a nun enthralled in erotic ecstasy in the scandalous "The Devils" (directed by Ken Russell), the lonely teacher in "Wetherby", a mystery novel writer in "Agatha", the sensitive Ruth Wilcox in "Howards End", the bold and strong-willed 'Julia' in Fred Zinneman's film for which she won an Oscar for Best Supporting Actress.

Acclaimed in theatre as well as on TV, Redgrave has always been politically engaged. At a very young age, she joined the Workers Revolutionary Party, where she campaigned for the plight of British workers, and embraced the causes of nuclear disarmament and the Palestinian people. At 87, she is back on the set of "The Estate," once again working alongside her husband Franco Nero.

The film's director is Carlo Gabriel Nero, the 54-year-old son of these two living legends who fell in love on the set of 'Camelot' in 1967 and would go on to appear together in ten more movies.



U.S. PREMIERE

A young psychopath with literary ambitions finds himself falling in love with a young American army nurse. We are in Bologna on the eve of the Liberation and, for this troubled young man, merely exchanging glances with the beautiful soldier is enough to make him think of her as the love of his life. By chance, the following year he moves to the American Midwest into a house adjacent to that of his beloved. The woman's elderly mother lives there, desperate for her daughter's disappearance: after the end of the war, she wrote home that she was going to marry an Italian man, and hasn't been heard from since.

There is a time for living and a time for remembering, the latter encapsulating an entire life in just one moment. This is perhaps the meaning of nostalgia: a feeling of helplessness for not being able to grasp or relive the past anew. As they share a sentiment of inadequacy and explore grotesque stories as well as disturbing nightmares, Avati's movie are all deeply rooted in Emilia-Romagna, the region where the filmmaker was born and bred and where he experienced all aspects of life: friendship, love, hate, fear, country life, religion, marriage. Pupi Avati, born in Bologna on November 3, 1938, explored various film genres without ever forgetting the atmosphere of his region of birth, always including some autobiographical elements in a number of movies that stir collective memories and universal feelings. Avati's stories revolve around the rural and pre-industrialized world, populated by characteristic figures who recur throughout his movies and have been portrayed by such performers as Lino Capolicchio, Gianni Cavina, Carlo Delle Piane, Diego Abatantuono, Alessandro

After trying his hand as a musician (jazz is his other big passion), together with his younger brother Antonio, a producer and screenwriter, Avati started creating low-budget but entirely independent films that explored a number of genres, from horror to crime, from political satire to the grotesque, breaking through with an original horror film entitled "The House with Laughing Windows"

However Avati is particularly admired for his focus on common feelings, his constant exploration of lost forgotten emotions, which result in melancholy-filled movies: "A School Outing" (1983,) 'We Three' (1984), 'Graduation Party,' (1985) 'Christmas Present' (1986), The Story of Boys and Girls' (1989), 'The Heart Is Everywhere' (2003), Joan's Father' (2008).

Avati also worked in the U.S., where he shot "Bix" (1991), a tribute to his beloved jazz music depicting the life of musician Leon 'Bix' Beiderbecke; and "Brothers and Sisters" (1992), exploring complicated family ties.

After "Magnificat" (1993) and "The Mysterious Enchanter" (1996), respectively evoking the religious atmosphere of the Middle Ages and Gothic environments in the 18th century, Avati later became immersed in a magical, historical and adventurous dimension of Crusaders in search of the Holy Shroud in "The Knights of the Quest" (2001). Pupi Avati has presided over the Federico Fellini Foundation, created in 1995, in memory of the great Rimini-born director. In 1995 Avati received the honorary title of Commander of the Order of Merit of the Italian Republic.


THE TALENTED PIETRO CASTELLITTO

Pietro Castellitto made his behindthe-camera debut with "The Predators" - the big Italian cinematic revelation at the 77th Venice International Film Festival, an original work that earned hir the Best Screenplay Award and was widely praised for its courage, ambition and outstanding personality, among the average national productions. Pietro Castellitto was born into a family of artists. After graduating with a degree

in Philosophy (and developing a penchant for Nietzsche,) Pietro decided to pursue a career in the movies. He is a cool and magnetic actor as well as a multilayered filmmaker who loves blending different genres, naturally moving from the perspective of an authentic film auteur to the approach of a pop artist, seamlessly creating a bridge between cinema and life, reality and fiction, word and image.

His most outstanding roles include the Italian soccer idol Francesco Totti in "Speravo de morì prima" and the smuggler Isola in Renato De Maria's "Robbing Mussolini". In 2024 Castellitto starred in the film "Diva Futura" as the pornographer and movie director Riccardo Schicchi. That same year, Pietro directed and starred in "Enea," an ambitious black comedy interweaving crime, love and friendship.

Leeting ERGIO

Castellitto is one of the most appreciated and well-rounded filmmakers and actors of the Italian and European film landscape, instinctively liked by audiences for his friendly ways and subtle irony; he is appreciated both in comedies and dramas for his ability to depict—in both genres—larger than life characters.

Sergio Castellitto became known to mainstream audiences with Ettore Scola's "The Family" and the comedies "Little Misunderstandings" by Ricky Tognazzi and "Stasera a casa di Alice" by Carlo Verdone.

His big dramatic role was for Marco Ferreri in "La carne" but he definitely rose to fame with Francesca Archibugi's "Il grande cocomero", in which he plays a young psychiatrist dealing with an epileptic girl, for which he was hailed as one of the best actors of his generation.

He went on to work with Jacques Rivette, Giuseppe Tornatore, Carlo Vanzina, Paolo Virzì, Gabriele Muccino and Mario Monicelli, but he proved his talent especially with director Marco Bellocchio: In "L'ora di religione" Castellitto incarnated a painter who rejects the canonization of his mother and the whole "religious marketing" around it and becomes opposed to his whole family and the high priests behind this project.

In 2004 Castellitto was again acclaimed by audience and critics alike for directing "Non ti muovere" — based on the novel with the same name by Margaret Mazzantini. Castellitto stars in the movie alongside Penelope Cruz. The artistic collaboration with Mazzantini — also his partner in life — dates back to when they met on stage in Chekov's "Three Sisters" and has been going strong for 30 years.

Castellitto worked on a number of prominent TV projects, appearing convincingly in the role of a judge on the TV series "Un cane sciolto"; as the cycling legend Fausto Coppi; the socially engaged priest Don Lorenzo Milani; Padre Pio; and the Italian race car driver and entrepreneur Enzo Ferrari in the TV miniseries by Carlo Carlei, telling the story of the car from inception to the present day.

For director Edoardo De Angelis, Castellitto incarnated the character of Luca Cupiello, in a TV version of the famous theater play "Natale in casa Cupiello"— a masterpiece of playwright Eduardo De Filippo.

Directed by Pupi Avati, Castellitto played the role of the great Italian poet Giovanni Boccaccio in "Dante", while for Gianluca Jodice, he was assigned the iconic role of Gabriele D'Annunzio in "The Bad Poet" — a film contemplating history and blending in espionage, political allegory and sentimental drama.

In 2023 Castellitto was directed for the first time by his son Pietro, also an actor and a filmmaker, in the movie "Enea."

In 2024 he took on the role of Cardinal Tedesco in "Conclave," helmed by Edward Berger and based on the novel by Robert Harris.

OUD TO BETTALIAN AMERICAN



American artists of Italian heritage continue to make their mark on the film industry

Their presence has been influential in the worlds of politics, entertainment, science, sports and literature. The contribution made by Italians to the history and culture of America is invaluable. 






A SICILIAN SET FOR RTIN SCORSE



In 2022, fifteen years after his passing, LUCIANO PAVAROTTI was awarded a star on the iconic Hollywood Boulevard: a prestigious acknowledgement of the talent of the worldwide famous tenor, who this year would have turned 90. But Big Luciano goes on in the history of music and the hearts of his

innumerable fans scattered around the world

mericans have always had a love affair with Italy. Whether it is Italy's wonderful Acuisine, incredible landscapes, culture, history or film, people love it. In Los Angeles, everybody has a special affinity for Italy. Numerous people of Italian descent settled here, in places such as San Pedro, where they became a mainstay of the fishing community. In the fall, Hollywood is the home of the annual Feast of San Gennaro. The event, sponsored by television personality Jimmy Kimmel, attracts thousands of people to enjoy Italian food, music and culture. The contribution of Italian artists to international show business has been officially acknowledged many times on Hollywood's Walk of Fame, where the world's most prominent stars are honored in recognition of their achievements in the fields of film, radio, music, theater and television, as well as for their civic and charitable commitments. Many of these stars bear Italian names, such as the orchestra conductor Arturo Toscanini, tenor Enrico Caruso, the legendary Rodolfo Valentino, three extraordinary actresses Anna Magnani, Sophia Loren and Gina Lollobrigida, director Bernardo Bertolucci, singer Andrea Bocelli and Maestro Ennio Morricone, the most beloved music composer in the film industry.

Before the glamorous night during which Morricone was presented with an Oscar for the score he composed for Quentin Tarantino's "The Hateful Eight," the legendary composer posed for photographers and TV crews as his Walk of Fame star was unveiled. Among those attending the ceremony was the "Pulp Fiction" director who has always been one of his biggest fans.

In 2019 a star was dedicated to the Italian filmmaker Lina Wertmuller, the first woman to receive an Oscar nomination for Best Director, adding to the list of Italian artists honored on the Hollywood Walk of Fame. In 2023 star was


The centennial of Carlo Di Palma's birth is honored by Los Angeles Italia 2025, in celebration of the work of the famed DOP who created the photography for numerous masterpieces, thus spreading appreciation for the Italian's talent throughout the world

The accuracy, the search for perfection, the concept of filmmaking as a work of art and not mere craft: these are the qualities of Carlo Di Palma, born in 1925 and passed in 2004, one of the most prominent artisans of Italian cinema. At the same time, he was a revolutionary artist who became known to the world thanks to Antonioni's 1964 "Red Desert" in which Di Palma subverted the rules of cinematic photography. The movie, which won a Golden Lion at the Venice Film Festival, is in fact a masterpiece of chromatic experimentation, where color becomes a lead character in the

But there is also another extraordinary filmmaker and Di Palma fan who has contributed to spreading his name around the world: Woody Allen collaborated with him on eleven movies, from "Hannah and Her Sisters" to "Deconstructing Harry." After being bewitched by Di Palma's work in Antonioni's "Blow Up" and "Identification of a Woman," the New York filmmaker entered into a unique, almost exclusive artistic partnership with Di Palma, as he shared with him the same ideas about space, color and light. The son of a florist who raised him among the colors of her shop, Di Palma accessed the world of cinema thanks to his father who repaired cameras, and his brother who worked as a gaffer at Rome's Palatine Studios. After working as an apprentice for such luminaries as Visconti, Rossellini and De Sica, Di Palma inaugurated his extraordinary career with a number of prestigious collaborations: with Mario Monicelli ("L'armata Brancaleone," "The Girl with a Pistol";) Ettore Scola ("Dramma della gelosia";) Gillo Pontecorvo ("Kapò";) Bernardo Bertolucci ("The Tragedy of a Ridicolous Man";) Roberto Benigni ("The Monster".)

An unparalleled master of color, Di Palma proved his talent in black and white as well, with such movies as "The Long Night of '43" by Florestano Vancini, "Divorce Italian Style" by Pietro Germi and Allen's "Shadows and Fog" whose story takes place in a Mitteleuropean city in the 1920s. For this film he found the widest range of colors for costumes and design elements to obtain the most varied nuances of gray.

Also appreciated for his work in socially themed documentaries as well as in concerts organized in prestigious architectonic locations, Di Palma has been a daring and extremely sensitive experimenter, a 360-degree artist who can be compared to the most relevant masters of light of the Italian

VERMIGLIO REMOTE RITES OF PASSAGE IN THE REMARKABLE MAURA DELPERO'S WARTIME DRAMA

The Grand Jury Prize recipient second movie by talented Italian film director Maura Delpero "Vermiglio" has been acclaimed by international audiences.

↑ fter being awarded the Grand Jury Prize at the 81st AVenice International Film Festival and earning Globes and EFA nominations as well as a public letter by filmmaker Jane Campion - who has defined herself "enchanted by the movie" -, Maura Delpero's "Vermiglio" has stirred up national hopes to see it included in the five Oscar finalists for "Best International Film" - despite the strong competition with Walter Salles' political drama "I'm Still Here," Jacques Audiard's gangster musical "Emilia Perez" and the animation masterpiece "Flow". Despite being out of the Oscar race, "Vermiglio" stands as a gem of arthouse filmmaking, able to reach wide-ranging audiences also beyond national borders.

Set in a mountain village in the Italian northern region of Trentino-Alto Adige at the end of Second World War, "Vermiglio" is the story of a family through which significant themes are expressed like the painful consequences of war, the mystery of death, women's physical and psychological confinement, strict religious rules and unflinching moral values which conflict with their wishes and generate a deep sense of frustration. However, female resistance and resilience can

provide their way out and a meaning to the tragic events unfolding. Not only does "Vermiglio" confirm the talent of filmmaker Maura Delpero but it also reveal the gracefulness and charisma of Martina Scrinzi, the 27-year-old





Directed by MAURO BORRELLI, the movie offers a cinematic journey through Jesus' final days

2006-2024 • NINETEEN SUCCESSFUL YEARS

2006 (February 26-March 4) The Italian cinema passed the test at the first L.A. Italia Festival with over 10,000 viewers attending thirty movie screenings.

Even though our Academy Award nominees didn't win - Cristina Comencini,

director of "Don't Tell"; Gabriella Pescucci, costume designer for "Charlie and the Chocolate Factory" and Dario Marinelli, music composer for "Pride & Prejudice"the Capri in the World Institute took home the awareness that "... a solid bridge for a cultural exchange is being built – since 1995 – between the Island of Capri with its "Capri, Hollywood" festival and Los Angeles, California," as declared by Pascal Vicedomini, founder and producer of these two events. Hollywood also witnessed the debut of festival co-founders Marina Cicogna, Franco Nero, Lina Wertmüller and Tony Renis (regarded as the musical 'soul' of the group and immediately elected its "Honorary Chairman"). For starters, the 2006 L.A. Italia event, whose official poster of the festival featured a night shot of the Colosseum, enjoyed the support of Cim Group Inc (with its principal Shaul Kuba), the Lazio Region, and Rai Trade, as well as Mibac (D.G.Cinema). Among the attractions that mostly engaged the audience, we recall: 1) Lina Wertmüller's film retrospective: The well-known Italian director was treated to a Hollywood party in her honor organized by producer David Codikov, complete with a welcoming speech by Al Pacino. She was also invited to lecture a class of students attending the University Southern California; 2) A retrospective about the talented Gabriele Muccino, presenting his first all-American movie with Will Smith; 3) Valentino and Gabriella Pescucci's costume exhibitions, the first based on nine elegant party gowns created for Gwyneth Paltrow, Renée Zellweger, Cate Blanchett, Kate Beckinsale, Jennifer Garner, Kate Hudson, Sandra Bullock and Elle MacPherson; the second on nine costumes created by Sartoria Tirelli in Rome for Michelle Pfeiffer, Jessica Lange, Uma Thurman, Demi Moore, Monica Bellucci, Jacqueline Bisset, Catherine Deneuve, Robert De Niro and Johnny Depp; 5) A photo expo on cinema in the Lazio Region, attended by two masters of the Italian haute cuisine: chefs Massimo Riccioli and Anna Dente; 6) NIAF's big gala night at the Regent Beverly Wilshire led by Jack Valenti (then the long-time president of the Mo-

tion Picture Association of America) with two exceptional guests: Oscar -winning actor Ernest Borgnine and L.A. Mayor Antonio Villaraigosa. Actors Raoul Bova, Stefania Rocca, Enrico Lo Verso and Carlo Carlei stood out among the official delegation, as did songwriter Gigi D'Alessio who was touring the West Coast at that time. Among the illustrious guests

were Oscar recipients Norman Jewison and Jon Voight (who recently was the extraordinary protagonist of the Rai-Lux Vide TV movie dedicated to Pope John Paul II, a role that won him and producer Tom Sternberg the L.A. Italia Excellence Award, designed by Micucci). With them were Paul Mazursky, Jacqueline Bisset, Dolph Lundgren, Roxanna Arquette, the up-and-coming star Gerard Butler, Keith Carradine and finally, producers Larry Turman, Lawrence Bender, Steven Paul and Barry Navidi.

The divine Ms. Sophia Loren made an appearance at the Silvia Damiani event.

2007 (February 18-24) This was the year of the big popular festival breakthrough on the West Coast: costume designer Milena Canoero was awarded her third Oscar - for Sofia Coppola's "Marie Antoinette". Sadly no prize went to makeup magicians Signoretti and Sodano.

The L.A. Italia event calendar presented a brilliant retrospective dedicated to legendary movie master Mario Monicelli, who was presented with a Lifetime Achievement Award by General Consul Diego Brasioli and IIC Director Francesca Valente, as well as with honors from the University of Southern California by Dean Elizabeth Dailey. This was the year of the collaboration with Shoah Foundation and Mimmo Calopresti's documentary, "Volevo solo vivere", screened on the opening day of the festival. The emotionally-charged event engaged both audiences and the media, who rushed in to listen to the speech given by Douglas Greenberg, Executive Director of USC's Shoah Foundation Institute for Visual History and Education. It was also

the year of the charity gala event for the

movie "Invisible Children", produced by MKFilm and Maria Grazia Cucinotta with UNICEF and the World Food Program. There was also a memorable tribute to maestro Ennio Morricone, who received the Academy's Lifetime Achievement Award from Clint Eastwood. Not to mention Italian rocker Vasco Rossi's surprise appearance at the special screening of Stefano Salvati's video-clip, in which he was the lead character.

The 2007 edition guests included Raoul Bova with Federico Moccia, Claudia Gerini with Federico Zampaglione and, next to Valeria Golino, Hollywood first-timer Riccardo Scamarcio, who connected immediately with Jeff Goldblum. Director Giulio Base, together with Dolph Lundgren and the Cruz sisters, Penelope and Monica, introduced his new movie "L'inchiesta". Italian-American screenwriter Bobby Moresco (Academy Award for "Crash") debuted as festival chairman that year, too. At the Chinese Theatre, and at the Italian Lounge at Trastevere in Hollywood & Highland Center (where singer Agostino Penna performed beautifully), Oscar winner Pietro Scalia, Carlo Gabriel Nero,

Stefano Veneruso, Martina Stella, Luca Lionello, actors Matthew Modine, John Savage, Gina Gershon, film directors Harold Becker and Mick Davis, and producers Avi Lerner and Chiara Tilesi were there too.

The official image of the 2007 Festival edition was Venice's Grand Canal, owing to an explicit request by the Venice Casino that supports the event together with Cinecittà Holding, the Lazio Region, the Campania Region, Sangemini and Cafe do Brazil.

2008 (February 17-23) The festival that year started in the best possible way: Bernardo Bertolucci got a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame, a tribute granted by the Hollywood Chamber of Commerce upon the request of the Capri in the World Institute. The Maestro was unable to attend due to his ailing health but nevertheless his star was unveiled in front of the Chinese Theatre. The classic Italian cinema was represented by directors Carlo Lizzani

and Citto Maselli, who were given the IIC Lifetime Achievement award by General Consul Nicola Faganello, and who - at the Chinese Theatre – gave an award to an exceptional guest: Italian-American actor and director Sylvester Stallone. Dante Ferretti, however, (with Francesca Lo Schiavo) was the main attraction as he received his second Oscar for his design of Tim Burton's "Sweeney Todd" sets. The same thrill was generated when composer Dario Marianelli basked in his moment of glory, bringing home the legendary statuette for scoring Joe Wright's "Atonement". The only one left out was the third Italian candidate, Andrea Jublin, a contender in the short film category. The Italian delegation also included actor and filmmaker Michele Placido, Lina Sastri, Raoul Bova, Enrico Lo Verso and newcomers Valeria Solarino (the Festival 'godmother'), Federico Moccia, Francesco Apolloni, Louis Nero, Ilaria Borrelli, Maurizio Aiello and Antonella Ponziani. Famous Italian songwriter Ron and the

Bologna-born 'soulman' Andrea Mingardi were highly appreciated for their musical contributions.

Next to them, a few giants of the US industry: Oscar winners Steven Zaillian, Paul Haggis and F. Murray Abraham (who was involved with Stefano Todini and Patrizia Pellegrino in a small movie shot in Umbria). And then Steven Seagal, Keith Carradine, Treat Williams, Tomas Arana, Johan Collins, Lindsay Lohan, Sofia Vergara (still unknown to the mainstream), Romina Power with her brother Tyrone Jr. and producers Mark Canton, Jeremy Thomas, Kevin King and Humberto Gatica. The official image of the 2008 edition was the Gulf of Naples projected onto a number of Hollywood buildings. The size of the audience revealed the growth of the event: about 13,000 people attended the Italian Art Gallery set up at the Hollywood & Highland Center. A photographic exhibition was arranged by the Experimental Centre of Cinematography about Bernardo Bertolucci with the title "Durante la rivoluzione" and "La Via del Petrolio" (in collaboration with Eni) was screened. Much admiration was generated by the costumes designed by artist Catia Dottori for Lizzani's film "Hotel Meina" and by the haute couture creations by late designer Egon Von Furstenberg (presented by his children Alex and Tatiana and by his exwife Diane von Furstenberg, now a fashion icon). 15,000 viewers visited the Mann Chinese 6 theatre to watch a selection of contemporary and classic movies. Among the other events, particularly appreciated was the tribute to Luciano Pavarotti (with the screening of the movie "Yes, Giorgio"), a few months after the tenor's death. 2009 (February 15-21) The work of legendary Vittorio

maker (for "La Ciociara"), to the audience which included film director Pupi Avati and his film-producer brother Antonio, both of whom received a warm Hollywood welcome as witnesses of the great contemporary cinema who have made their mark on the history of world entertainment. Pupi Avati was lauded with a movie retrospective, the IIC prize, and a tribute at U.S.C. arranged by young professor Alex Ago and about 500 students.

2008 was the year of "Gomorra" – the big hit movie by Matteo Garrone exposing Naples' criminal underworld. "Los Angeles, Italia" promoted a positive side of the city with movies shot in the Gulf that are part of film history and special guests from its surroundings. Chief among them was Massimo Ranieri, a legendary representative of the Neapolitan theatre and song who, after showing his film about Pulcinella, gave the mask of Lello Esposito as a gift to Oscar favorite Mickey Rourke ("The Wrestler") who had just attended the Gala at the Kodak Theatre. With them, director Pappi Corsicato, musicians Tony Esposito and songwriter Guido Lembo who, at Jack and Leslie Kavanaugh's home, involved Michael Bublè and Tony Renis in an improvised concert. Same response for Guido at the Chinese Theatre where along with anchor-woman Simona Ventura, another star was singing: Italian-American "Easy Rider" interpreter, Peter Fonda. Stylist Rocco Barocco arranged an haute

couture exhibition at the Italian Art Gallery at Hollywood & Highland Center: twenty "vintage" costumes told the story of twenty years of work within an exceptional background: the photographic exhibition "La Campania e il Cinema." One of the most emotional mo-


ments was the tribute to legendary producer Franco Cristaldi ("Cinema Paradiso") with his wife Zeudi Araya





This was one of the most thrilling days of the 2018 edition of the Los Angeles, Italia Film Fashion and Art Fest which traditionally precedes the Academy Awards and whose goal is promoting the best of Italian cinema along its key players, during a week of screenings, events, meetings and galas.

The festival's pièce de résistance was Guadagnino's movie "Call Me by Your Name," which was in the running for four Academy Awards (Best Movie, Best Actor, Best Adapted Screenplay and Best Song). In the weeks leading up to the ceremony, the talented Italian film director enjoyed the extraordinary reactions generated by the movie among critics and audience alike all over the world.

Another honoree of the 13th edition of the Festival was Tiziano Ferro, who received the 'Italian Excellence Award' during its opening night ceremonies. Ferro sang some of his best-known hits - "L'amore è una cosa semplice" and "Non me lo so spiegare" – as he addressed his speech to all the Italians who live and work in Hollywood.  $2019^{\text{The 14th edition of Los Angeles Italia, the film festival}}$ which takes place in Hollywood during the week preceding the Oscars, opened with Claudio Giovannesi's "La paranza dei bambini" based on a novel by Roberto Saviano and selected for competition at the Berlin Film Festival. Giovannesi's movie once again reveals stories of denied childhood in social environments dominated by criminal bosses, and on the adolescents' penchant to escape society's rules.

Alessandro Preziosi and twin sisters Angela and Marianna Fontana were the first Italian movie stars to accept their 2019 Italian Excellence Awards at the Chinese Theatre. Preziosi greeted the audience with a performance honoring Luigi Pirandello; the actor also presented a selection of his films including the recent "Nessuno come noi" by Volfango de Biasi. Marianna Fontana presented "Capri-Revolution," an exclusive chapter that belongs to a hypothetical film trilogy

through which director Mario Martone aims at reflecting of time and history. Angela Fontana is the leading character in a feature film dedicated to the Basilicata region. The screening of 'Lucania' paid a tribute to the city of Matera, the 2019 European Capital of Culture, and to the iconic filmmaker Francis Ford Coppola (whose family comes from that area), on his 80th birthday, to honor his strong ties to his Italian roots.

The 2019 edition of the festival, chaired by Igino Straffi, a leader in the Italian animation industry, was attended by actress Maria Grazia Cucinotta, Hayma Washington, former president and CEO of the Academy of Television Arts & Sciences, screenwriter Nick Vallelonga (who later went on to win two Academy Awards for "The Green Book"), Andy Garcia, the American actor of Cuban descent, the young Italian talent Matteo Rovere (who presented "Il primo re," an original film on Rome's founding entirely spoken in proto-italic language) and the legendary Franco Nero, one of the most charismatic personalities of the Italian cinema, beloved by such film luminaries as Huston, Petri, Bellocchio, Chabrol and an inspiration for Quentin Tarantino who filmed "Django Unchained" as a successor of Sergio Corbucci's 1966 movie "Django." The festival's closing ceremony was



attended by many contenders for the Academy's 'golden statuette'. Included were Vallelonga, Adam McKay, director of "Vice," one of the nominees in the 'Best Film' category, Nicholas Britell and Terence Blanchard the composers of 'If the Street Could Talk" from the "BlacKkKlansman, Marc Shaiman and Scott Wittman, writers of "The Place Where Lost Things Go," a new song from "Mary Poppins Returns," and Anthony Rossomando, one of the writers of "Shallow," which was performed by Lady Gaga and Bradley Cooper in the acclaimed "A Star is Born."














COYA FORECASTS FOR 2025

This year is set to achieve considerable new results for a key sector of the Italian economy, after the already booming numbers of 2024

For tourism in Italy, 2024 was an extraordinary year. There were more than 458 million visitors, with an increase of 2.5% compared to the previous year due to an impressively growing number of tourists visiting the Bel Paese.

The estimates are provided by the Tourism Study Centre of Florence for Assoturismo Confesercenti.

"Tourism is a precious source of revenue for our nation, as was confirmed by the Florence Study Centre and the

Tourism is a precious source of revenue for our nation, as was confirmed by the Florence Study Centre and the Ministry's National Tourism Observatory. We heartfully thank the tourism professionals for this continued growth," reads a note from Tourism Minister Daniela Santanchè. Over the course of the year, despite the increase in prices which has particularly affected sectors providing services (not just in Italy but all over the world), the Italian tourism system showed good resilience, especially aided by the influx of foreign tourists, who recorded an uninterrupted growth trend for most of the year. Foreign visitors reached 251.5 million (+7.4%) with 72.1 million visitors flying into our country (+6.3%).

Cities full of art, its countryside and coast, hills and lakes of breathtaking beauty: Italy is an ever increasingly appealing destination for holiday

travelers attracted more and more by our wonderful country and its wealth of offerings.

According to the reported data, the Italian region with the highest number of tourists is Lazio, with Rome as the main tourist destination. The capital city is in fact one of the most visited cities in the world thanks to its rich historical, cultural and artistic heritage. Rome is home to such iconic monuments as the Colosseum, the Roman Forum, St Peter's Basilica and the Vatican. Other frequently visited regions include Tuscany, with its art-rich cities such as Florence, Pisa and Siena, and Campania — especially Naples, the Amalfi Coast, the archaeological site of Pompeii and the beautiful gulf islands (Capri, Ischia, Procida).

A further boost came from food and wine tourism, cultural tourism and ecotourism, sectors that encourage travellers to discover more hidden gems and authentic experiences. Sustainability, a digitization of the sector, and service quality are key elements for the future of Italian tourism, along with hospitality services able to meet the new needs of global travelers.

FOCUS ON ITALIAN CUCINA

Screenings, meetings, conferences and show cooking will support Italy's bid to become a UNESCO World Heritage Site following a proposal by the Minister of Agriculture and Food Sovereignty

As part of the 20th anniversary of the 'Los Angeles, Italia Festival' and on the eve of the Oscars, the Capri in The World Institute and The Artists Club Italia are promoting a special project: 'Focus on the Italian Cuisine 2025'. At this most electrifying moment in the global entertainment industry and in collaboration with the Sorrento Film & Food Festival, the event offers various activities including screenings, meetings, conferences and show cooking to support the bid to make Italian cuisine an Intangible Heritage of Humanity, as has been promoted by the Minister of Agriculture, Food Sovereignty and Forestry.

In striving to express the country's deepest soul, Italian cinema has often brought to light the country's great agricultural, gastronomic and wine-making traditions, promoting the history of territories, regions, and the many individuals involved in the preservation of

their food and wine heritage, now at risk of being taken over by new international entities unable to offer anything but bold imitations of an excellence that has few rivals in the world.

Practical support will therefore be offered through the Focus initiative to strengthen relations between professionals in the wine and food sector, and to promote Italy by showcasing the best regional wine and food products. Consequently, tourism in the Peninsula (including film productions) is bound to increase, with an emphasis on the most iconic culinary scenes from Italian films that have contributed to creating a legend.

These objectives will be pursued through meetings, debates, conferences, exhibitions and screenings in California during the festival.









ITALIAN CUCINA IS A CANDIDATE FOR THE UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE LIST

As in late March 2023 the Italian government, through the Minister of Agriculture Francesco Lollobrigida, officially announced a bid for Italian food to be included in the UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage.

The nomination dossier emphasises the impact that Italian cuisine has had in shaping the country's rich biocultural diversity. The Italian food tradition has been defined by the European Foog Agency as a "set of social practices, rites and gestures based on and characterized by local knowledge, totally free of rankings". Italian cuisine is not just about food or simple cookbooks, it's also a set of social practices, habits and gestures that lead to considering the preparation and consumption of a meal as a moment of sharing and community. It is a collective ritual of a people that conceives of food as a distinctive cultural element. In Italy, cooking is a way of taking care of family, friends and patrons. It is a patchwork of many local skills, an expression of creativity and knowledge that becomes tradition and is passed on through the generations. Italian cuisine is part of our history and a heritage for 60 million Italians living in the country, for 80 million Italians and their descendants living elsewhere in the world, and for the many foreigners who love and are inspired by the Italian lifestyle.

Presenting the nomination is an opportunity to explain to other countries about the background of Italy's products and their evolution, made up of history, culture, biodiversity, atmosphere and well-being.



Since 1997, he has taught postgraduate courses and master classes dedicated to media and audiovisual production, at such prestigious universities as the Rossellini Institute, the University of Florence, La Sapienza in Rome, and the Catholic University of Milan.



A documentary celebrates a generous artist appreciated for popularizing the Neapolitan "sceneggiata"

Merola is still regarded as an outstanding artist who brought appreciation for Neapolitan culture to the world with his unforgettable voice. He is a true legend whose personality, energy and stage presence made him popular in theater, music and movies. Mario Merola was a king of the "sceneggiata," reviving a theater genre that was popular at the beginning of the 1900s, bringing it to unimagined new heights. A powerful singer and natural charmer, Merola could stir strong emotions in ordinary people, arousing a variety of feelings - from anger towards an unjust villain to the beartbreaking nostalgia for their country of Italians living abroad. Merola was able to generate empathy in the audience as they could identify with his characters and become passionate about his adventures and eventually deeply moved.

Merola has also become a symbol of Naples' noble songbook

(especially the one by the poet and lyricist Libero Bovio), and he was a leading actor in numerous hit films during the 70s and 80s ("Da Corleone a Brooklyn," "Zappatore," "Lacrime napulitane"). Recently his life has been celebrated in a documentary titled "Il re di Napoli: Storia e leggenda di Mario Merola" by director Massimo Ferrari, with the participation of a number of well known Neapolitan artists including Gigi D'Alessio, Nino D'Angelo, Marisa Laurito, Goffredo Fofi, Maurizio De Giovanni, as well as Merola's children: Francesco, Roberto and Loredana.


A MAN AND AN ATHLETE


By "intangible cultural heritage," we mean the practices, representations, expressions, knowledge, know-how, social uses, collective festivities (including religious ones), and instruments, objects, manufactures, and cultural spaces associated with them. These communities recognize these elements as part of Campania's cultural heritage and pass them on from generation to generation. They are constantly recreated in response to their environment, their interaction with nature, and their history. This sense of identity and continuity is promoted by respecting cultural diversity and human creativity. Practices registered with IPIC are enclosed in the Catalogue of Campania's Intangible Heritage.





The production has been defined 'crystal' for its impressive visual impact on the two-thousand-year-old Arena. The emotionally charged Maestro's pages are still capable of enrapturing generations of spectators, and attracting and delighting newcomers and opera connoisseurs alike.

Rai Cultura, the RAI portal dedicated to cultural insights into Art, Literature, History, Philosophy, Music, Cinema, Theatre, Dance, and Science, is paying due homage to one of the greatest Italian artists appreciated throughout the world. After the acclaim of "The Barber of Seville" and "La Traviata," the Neapolitan director Mario Martone has once again been entrusted with a film based on an opera: "La Bohème", based on the acclaimed work by Giacomo Puccini. A much-loved opera, actually one of the most frequently performed in theatres around the world, "La Bohème" delves into the thrill of youth, and the pain caused by the awareness of its transience.

The libretto tells the love story of embroiderer Mimì and writer Rodolfo who, together with their artist friends, face the hardships of a poor life with a spirit of adventure, until they are eventually crushed by reality.

With a record-breaking number of nominations for a female singer, US composer Diane Warren, a long-time friend of the 'Los Angeles, Italia festival', has garnered a 16th Oscar nomination for her original song "The Journey" included in the score of "The six triple eight".

The prestigious statuette has often crossed paths with the career of the amazing Warren, including with "Seen", the English version of Laura Pausini's "Io Sì". Diane Warren is considered to be among the most prolific and successful contemporary songwriters of our time. A quick glance at her list of Top Ten hits reveals a range of musical genres and styles so diverse it's difficult to believe the songs could have come from the same person.

Songwriter, musician and record producer, Warren rose to prominence in 1983, and has since written for and co-written songs with multiple singers, as well as for several feature films. She has written nine number one songs and 32 Top 10 songs on the Billboard Hot 100 chart. Additionally, two of the top 13 hits in the Hot 100's 57-year history were composed by her. Warren has won a Grammy, an Emmy, two Golden Globes, three consecutive Billboard Music Awards for Songwriter of the Year, and has been nominated for thirteen Academy Awards. She has written some of the most memorable songs of our time, including Leanne Rimes' "How Do I Live," Cher's "If I Could Turn Back

Time" and Aerosmith's "I Don't Want To Miss a Thing."
Diane Warren has written songs for such legends as Elton
John, Tina Turner, Barbra Streisand, Aretha Franklin,
Roberta Flack and Roy Orbison. Artists such as Lady Gaga,
Cher, Patti LaBelle, 'N Sync, Gloria Estefan, Britney Spears,
Christina Aguilera, Reba McEntire, Beyonce, Whitney
Houston, Enrique Iglesias, Aerosmith, Ricky Martin, Faith
Hill, Celine Dion, Mary J. Blige and LeAnn Rimes have also
graced the charts with her songs.

Warren's massive success as a songwriter has offered her the opportunity to support a number of charitable causes. She is a Buddy for Life at AIDS Project Los Angeles and an honorary committee member of PETA. She has been a key donor to the Simon Wiesenthal Center Museum of Tolerance and founded the David S. Warren Weekly Entertainment Series at the Jewish Home for the Aging, a program she established in memory of her father.
